Q: Will this eventually be a required third party tool for FDOT projects?

A: Most likely not, but it was a business decision to move to Bluebeam because of its flexibility

Q: Is this free?

A: Revu is a paid application. Bluebeam Studio is included in Revu for no additional charge. Bluebeam Vu is a free viewer which allows users to view pdf file and participate in Studio Sessions.

Q: Will this be used in-house for FDOT similar to Axiom tools in the past?

A: It is currently in our standard MicroStation workstation build. It is also in the Civil 3D State Kit as a separate Bluebeam Ribbon.

Q: Is the page number look-up tool (Automark) able to handle alpha-numeric series; for example: B1-1, B1-2, & B2-1?

Q: How did you do the cloud plus?

A: Cloud + is a selection under "Shapes" on the Markup tab.

Q: Where is the Capture photo gallery stored in the file structure?

A: Photos in the Capture Gallery are embedded in the pdf file itself. There is no need to transmit the images separately if sharing the pdf with colleagues.

Q: I don’t have cloud plus; is this in a later version?


A: Cloud+ is available in Revu 2015 and higher.

Q: Is there or can there be an option to store pictures in another directory rather than in the file or as a reduced image?

A: At this time there is no method to reference the image files rather than embed them.

Q: How can I make a PDF open to the first page and not where I left off?

A: Click Settings then Preferences (or type Ctrl+K), select the Document option on the left, then uncheck "Remember Last Page"



Q: How does the Studio cloud work with Projectwise DMS?

A: With Revu installed on your computer you will need to make sure the Projectwise plugin is enabled in the Bluebeam Administrator. You will then be able to push pdfs directly to Studio Sessions by right clicking on the file in the Projectwise Explorer. Alternatively, you can start a Studio Session and add the files when prompted. Files will be checked out of Projectwise while the Session is active.

Q: It would be fantastic if the check-in document from studio session is updated as a revised set rather than overwriting the original file.

Q: Can you go over attachments with and without the icon - what is the difference? Can you add the icon later if you add without first?

A: Images can be placed directly on the sheet or placed in a Capture Gallery, which embeds the images within a markup. There is currently no easy method to move images already placed on a sheet to a Capture Gallery. More information about Capture can be found here:

Q: Is it possible to change a setting somewhere to be able to scroll through multiple sheets in "fit page" view using only the scroll wheel (not holding down ctrl key); similar to how it works in Adobe?

A: Revu will default to page scrolling in 8.5x11 documents and zoom mode for larger documents. To change that setting in each document, select the appropriate option at the bottom of the screen:



The left icon switches to zooming, the right icon switches to page scrolling.

Another option is to change the default settings. To do that, click on Settings then Preferences (or type Ctrl+K) and select the Navigation option on the left. The top two drop-down options allow you to override the default mouse wheel behavior.
