Ed Perez is Senior Vice President and head of Corradino's Construction Engineering and Inspection Division. Mr. Perez's recent experience includes serving as the Resident Engineer for the I-95 Mobility 2000 project in Palm Beach County. He was responsible for managing eight construction projects with a value of \$400M. While working on the I-95 Mobility 200 Projects, Ed Perez developed processes to control time and cost and ensure all contract administration is performed according to the guidelines established by the Department. Most

recently, Ed Perez and The Corradino team began work as the Oversight CEI on the first ever Public Private Partnership Project in the state of Florida, the I-595 Express. Prior to joining Corradino in 1999, Mr. Perez was the head of construction engineering for District IV of the Florida Department of Transportation, where he was responsible for the management of the construction Work Program for that District that averaged \$200-\$250 million dollars per year in construction contracts.

Responsible for the management of nine construction projects with a construction cost in excess of \$ 390M dollar. Developed processes to minimize time and cost overruns, obtain a quality product and ensure all contract administration is performed according to the guidelines established by the Department.

Mobility 2000, Pre–Engineering Services, I–95 HOV Palm Beach County– Responsible for the pre–construction activities on several I–95 HOV projects, developed special provisions for all the projects including I–95 Regional DRBs, no–excuse bonus, limitation of operations, and others. Made recommendations and implemented project limits changes to ensure proper transition between projects. Coordinate all constructabilities and biddability reviews performed.

2000–2002: Senior Vice President/The Corradino Group, Inc., In charge of budgeting, scheduling, manpower assignment, marketing and quality control for Corradino's Florida divisions. Corradino is a multidiscipline firm in Transportation Design, Planning, Traffic Engineering, Water/Wastewater Design, Construction Administration, and Architecture. The Engineering Division is in charge of the design of roadway and transportation projects, water/sewer infrastructure and site/civil design jobs. The Construction Division performs project management duties, construction inspection, and performs constructability and biddability reviews. Mr. Perez de Morales has stressed and modified the quality control process for Corradino and is working to establish processes and procedures for improving management strategies on all Corradino's projects.

1996–1999: FDOT District 6 Construction Engineer

Responsible for the management of the construction work program for the District. The District Construction Department consisted of approximately 100 employees with a salary allocation in excess of \$5 million and an operating budget of \$250 thousand per year. The construction contracts averaged \$200–\$250 million per year.

Mr. Perez de Morales's duties and responsibilities include overall contract administration on the District work program, including progress and final payment to consultant and contractors; review, negotiation and approval of requests for change orders; and claim analysis on settlement of disputed issues. Monitoring cost and time on all contracts to ensure that cost/time overruns remained within state target.

Making recommendations to the District Director of Production on the most effective method of contracting (i.e. Cost and Time, Lane Rental, Incentive/Dis-Incentive). Recommendations were based on project location and type of contract. (i.e. Reconstruction, milling and resurfacing). Providing liaison with other governmental agencies and local municipalities in the coordination of joint project agreements. Coordinating interdistrict activities with all operations (Traffic Operations, Maintenance) and production (Design, Right-of-Way, Utilities) functions through the applicable Department heads.

1986–1996: Assistant District Construction Engineer, FDOT District 4

Responsible for providing support to the District Construction Engineer for the management of the Construction Program. Serve as a reviewer to all claims, time extensions, and interpretation of specifications.

Responsible for the supervision of all Consultant Construction Engineer Inspection (CEI) contracts within the District. The scope of responsibilities included over 10 Consultant Agreements with fees of approximately \$15 million and 14 construction contracts in excess of \$100 million.

1984–1986: Assistant Resident Engineer, FDOT District 4

Responsible for the supervision of all construction projects in Broward County. The scope of responsibility included the supervision of 18 project engineers and approximately 30 construction contracts in excess of \$175 million. Functions performed included negotiation of all changes, time extensions/ claim analysis of all contracts, and personnel assignments.
