


Transportation Improvements – Florida at Work

ARRA Implementation Status in FDOT District Five

- 156 ARRA road and bridge projects in District Five.
- 151 are local road, safety, and transportation enhancements benefiting the citizens of local communities.
- 5 projects benefit transit agencies.
- 16 projects improve the State Road System, including I-95.
- 15 bridges repaired, or replaced, using ARRA funds.

ARRA Project Highlights

- \$252,766,848 spent on ARRA projects in Central Florida.
- Major projects include:
 - Widening four miles of I-95 in southern Brevard County, in Palm Bay.
 - Widening six miles of Baseline Road in Marion County, near Ocala.
 - Widening three miles of State Road 50, west of Orlando, in Winter Garden.
 - Widening almost a mile of congested State Road 434, north of Orlando, in Altamonte Springs. This project is complete.
 - Widening nearly four miles of U.S. 27 in Lake County, in the City of Clermont. This project was visited by Vice President Joseph Biden.
 - Building a new road and bridge over Interstate 95 in Daytona Beach at Dunn Avenue. This opens an area on the northwest side of Daytona Beach to further economic development.

These projects are being funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009
