4/9/2012	Landscaping: 18 Mile Stretch Animal Crossing #2 (on S.R. 5/U.S. 1)		Deferred	The department agreed with the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) and Fish & Wildlife to mitigate an area disturbed (cleared and used to store fill) during construction of a recently completed roadway project. It is proposed to restore the area and add shrubs. The estimate is \$60,000 to \$65,000. Most of this area belongs to the department. However, apparently the contractor 'overcleared' onto private property. John Palenchar and Barbara Culhane are aware of this. Get the Right of Way (ROW) Office involved; the department will need an easement or agreement to do work on private property. The contractor should restore the overcleared area. The department can't spend money unnecessarily. Harold Desdunes will find out what's going on.	

4/9/2012	Landscaping: Outdoor Advertising Tree Relocations		Approved	A state statute requires the department to provide clear view zones to all legally permitted outdoor advertising billboards. Along S.R. 826/Palmetto Expressway near NW 122 Street there is a need to relocate about eighteen Royal palms, trim or relocate four or five Gumbo Limbo trees and trim several other trees. The estimate is \$7,500 to \$10,000. On S.R. 826 at NW 10 Avenue there is a need to relocate about nine Sabal palms and remove about 34 small palms. This estimate also is \$7,500 to \$10,000. The billboard company has not sent the department legal notice yet because the department has been working closely with the company, but this work should be done as soon as possible.	
4/9/2012	Landscaping: Islamorada MM 76.5 Landscape Buffer (on S.R. 5/U.S. 1/Overseas Highway)		Approved	There is a gap in the existing landscape buffer adjacent to condominiums at mile marker (MM) 76.5, oceanside. The request is from the Homeowners' Association (HOA) with a supporting letter from the Village of Islamorada indicating that the village would assume maintenance of the plantings. The estimate to add shrubs and trees is \$8,600 to \$10,000. The department will need a formal maintenance agreement with the village for the landscaping, not just a letter.	
4/9/2012	Landscaping: NW 3 Avenue from NW 1 Street to NW 2 Street Graffiti Issue		Approved	The Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) requested that the department study this area and consider utilizing landscaping to minimize graffiti on the retaining wall for S.R. 9A/I-95 northbound. A recent project installed landscaping in this area, but graffiti has become a problem and the MPO believes the solution may involve planting additional shrubs and/or vines. The rough estimate is \$2,500 to \$5,000. The department told the MPO that this item would be reviewed and the department would not be able to take action until the landscape push-button contract is available in May 2012.	

4/9/2012	Landscaping: S.R. 934/71 Street from Bay Drive to S.R. A1A/Collins Avenue Irrigation Repairs		Deferred	During resurfacing project number 419825-1 at this location, reportedly the contractor tore up an irrigation pipe. (The resurfacing project had an expected completion date of March 30, 2012.) The City of Miami Beach is requiring the department to make repairs to this portion of their existing irrigation system. The contractor submitted a cost which was considered high for the repairs. The construction engineering and inspection (CEI) engineer reportedly still is trying to negotiate the price down to an acceptable amount, but is not very optimistic. The estimate to install the irrigation sleeve and polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipe and replace some irrigation heads is \$12,000 to \$16,000. The city would like the repairs done as soon as possible. Was the city responsible to report and mark the 'locates' (location of the irrigation system)? Mark Croft and Tony Soto will check, e-mail the answer to Gus Pego and copy Paul Moss.	
4/9/2012	Landscaping: Tree Trimming		Deferred	Trees along S.R. 972/Coral Way, S.R. 976/SW 40 Street/Bird Road and S.R. 959/SW 57 Avenue/Red Road have low-hanging branches which should be trimmed for safety. An arborist must mark the trees to show which branches to trim and where. Paul Moss' landscape push-button contract includes the needed expertise. Renato Marrero manages one or more contracts for tree trimming. Perhaps their contractors can work together on this issue. Coral Way is historic and has a tree society. The department needs signed and sealed plans to present to the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO). Check the records of the previous tree-trimming project there. Also meet with the City of Miami. District Six might be able to get phase 72 (maintenance) contingency funds from Central Office for this work. The work may need a separate project. Also the trimming will require maintenance of traffic (MOT).
