8/6/2012	BDQ19	Amendment	Deferred	Amendment 8. Districtwide mitigation maintenance and monitoring services for mitigation sites required by environmental permits. Corzo Castella Carballo Thompson Salman, P.A. (C3TS). Original contract amount \$100,000; current amount \$2,079,000; 92% of contract committed; requested increase in budgetary ceiling \$200,000. Two year contract (with one year renewal option), executed on May 18, 2010, and due to expire on May 17, 2013. The consultant continues to be qualified and performs in a superior manner. This increase in the budgetary limit is in the Consultant Acquisition Plan (CAP) as an August commitment. A large mitigation job for the North Roosevelt project was done under this contract and charged to the relevant project number. Large mitigation jobs can be done as standalone projects instead of under districtwide contracts. Make sure to use the correct method. This is a consultant contract but it was used to do 'construction' work on a mitigation site. Pay items were added to pay invoices. Now some of the palms are in declining condition. Debora Rivera questioned whether adding palms for aesthetic purposes is the best use of the district's resources. The rough estimate is \$9,000 to \$10,000 to add some palms to two medians between S.R. 825/SW 137 Avenue and SW 140 Avenue. The work would be done under landscape push-button contract number E6H48 with Arazoza Brothers. Do not plant any shade trees there. Do not plant vegetation with 'aggressive' root structures in medians, or it will damage the pavement.	Paul Moss

The trees are out of warranty. Debora Rivera questioned whether adding palms for aesthetic purposes is the best use of the district's resources. 8/6/2012	Planting of Trees & Palms without a Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement			The district has plans to build bulbouts on S.R. 934/NW 79 Street without trees or palms because they are in an unincorporated area (so there is no local city to sign a maintenance memorandum of agreement (MMOA) for the plants, and the district should not take on additional landscape maintenance obligations). The district should discuss these matters internally before contacting Central Office about them. Ask Miami-Dade County's Right-of-Way Aesthetic and Assets Management (RAAM) Division (in the Infrastructure Maintenance section of the Public Works and Waste Management Department) to 'adopt' the trees. If there is a project where the local city and/or the RAAM Division refuse to sign a MMOA, bring that project to the PARA Committee.
