34. LIST OF AGENCIES, ORGANIZATIONS, AND PERSONS TO WHOM COPIES OF THE STATEMENT ARE SENT

34-1 OVERVIEW

Copies of all Draft Environmental Impact Statements (DEISs) and Final Environmental Impact Statements (FEISs) are circulated for comment to all government agencies expected to have jurisdictional responsibility, interest, or environmental expertise in a particular project. This circulation is in accordance with the Implementing Procedural Provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act established by the Council on Environmental Quality (section 1502.10(i)). To document this circulation, a section is included in the Draft and Final EIS which lists all Federal, State and local agencies which received the document for review and comment.

The format of the EIS has a section entitled "List of Agencies, Organizations, and Persons to Whom Copies of the Statement Are Sent". This section is composed of a listing of all agencies which have or will receive the DEIS and FEIS. The "List of Agencies, Organizations, and Persons to Whom Copies of the Statement Are Sent" section is situated in the document between the "List of Preparers" section and the "Index" (Part 1, Chapter 6).

This list of agencies is developed by the Central Environmental Management Office (CEMO) in consultation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and is generally composed of Federal and State agencies who have expressed an interest in reviewing Draft and/or Final EISs produced by the Department. Generally, the review request is due to jurisdictional considerations, environmental interest, or expertise.

In preparing the DEIS, the District Environmental Management Office (DEMO) develops a document distribution list of Federal and State agencies. DEMO also adds to this list, for local coordination purposes, the appropriate local agencies and interest groups with whom coordination should be carried out. Because projects vary in location and issues, this list will also vary from project to project and should be reviewed each time an EIS is developed.

The distribution of the Draft and Final EIS is made by DEMO consistent with Part 1, Chapters 6 and 7. DEMO will also distribute copies to local agencies and interest groups.

34-2 PROCEDURE

34-2.1 Preparation of the List of Agencies

DEMO reviews the list of agencies provided in Figure 34.1 and selects the appropriate Federal and State agencies to whom the DEIS and FEIS are to be sent. DEMO also incorporates into this list the local agencies (i.e., Regional Planning Council and Water Management District) which have either requested a copy of the document or which the District has determined should receive the document as a part of the overall project development process.

Figures 34.1 and 34.2 provide complete lists of all Federal and State agencies (including District / Field offices) to whom documents are circulated. In addition, the list in Figure 34.2 provides the number of copies requested by each agency. Unless circumstances warrant otherwise, the agencies shown in the Federal and State lists below will always be contained in an EIS. The only exception to this is when a notation is provided which stipulates under what circumstances an agency is included on the list. Also provided in this section is a listing of local agencies. The analyst should select from these lists the appropriate agencies and add them to agencies contained on the Federal and State lists.
