

FDOT Environmental Program Affects all areas




SEMO's Lead Role

- ◆ **Develop policy and procedures to eliminate barriers and create opportunity**
- ◆ **Manage DOT environmental programs**
- ◆ **Provide Training**
- ◆ **Provide technical support – Guide, Support, Lead, Finish**
- ◆ **Intra/interagency coordination and support**
- ◆ **Champions of national initiatives**
- ◆ **Expedite project delivery**

Several laws and regulations, but primarily NEPA. What is NEPA?

- ◆ National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended
- ◆ Requires an assessment of the environmental effects federal actions
- ◆ Purpose of the environmental review process:
 - Inform citizens and others of the action
 - Citizen involvement
 - Consideration of effects to the human, natural, and physical environment
 - Avoid, minimize and for unavoidable impacts mitigate
 - Informed decisions
- ◆ PD&E Process is how FDOT complies with NEPA

Roadmap for Expedited Project Delivery

- ◆ Promote consistency, predictability, repeatability
- ◆ Clarify, simplify and focus processes
- ◆ Explore flexibilities in regulations and processes
 - Monitor, engage and influence state and national policies
 - Programmatic approaches
- ◆ Remain current
- ◆ Better connect the transportation environmental review process
- ◆ Communicate with Districts and partners
- ◆ Modify manuals and procedures
