FDOT hosts public meeting to discuss building express lanes along I-95 in St. Johns and Duval counties

St. Augustine – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is hosting a public meeting March 10 from 4:30-6:30 p.m. in the Legends Ballroom at the Renaissance World Golf Village Resort, 500 South Legacy Trail, 32092, to discuss proposed express lanes along I-95 in St. Johns and Duval counties.

FDOT representatives will be available at the meeting to provide information and answer questions. A Florida's Turnpike representative will be available to speak about electronic tolling and SunPass.

FDOT proposes constructing express lanes along I-95 from International Golf Parkway in St. Johns County to I-295 in Duval County. Express lanes are an innovative concept to manage traffic congestion and provide choices for motorists. These additional lanes will provide more capacity in areas where traffic congestion is a major problem. The feasibility of potential noise barrier walls is being evaluated as part of the project study.

The average traffic along this section of I-95 ranges from 78,000 to more than 93,000 vehicles per day.
