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DISTRICT ONE ROADWATCH REPORT #50 FOR WEEK OF December 11, 2016

District One is 12 counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk and Sarasota

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit www.FL511.com or dial “511” from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state. If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

Southbound I-75 Weigh Station (mile marker 160) in Punta Gorda: Construction project: Work is underway to rebuild the southbound weigh station on the west side of the roadway. Once work is completed; crews will begin to rebuild the northbound weigh station on the east side of the roadway. Motorists should not expect lane closures on I-75. Estimated completion is summer 2017. The contractor is R.M. Williams Construction, Inc.

I-75 from south of Harborview Road (mile marker 167) to Sumter Boulevard (mile marker 182): Construction project: This project widens the road from four to six lanes and adds a 12-foot travel lane and 10-foot shoulder to the inside of existing northbound and southbound I-75. Motorists should expect lane closures on I-75 during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.

- Motorists should expect periodic travel lane shifts throughout the duration of construction.

- **Motorists should expect the inside northbound lane on the bridge over the Peace River to be closed through the duration of the project.**

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2017. The contractor is Astaldi Construction Corporation.

I-75 over Harborview Road: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday while crews perform maintenance work on the bridge, weather permitting. Flaggers will maintain both directions of traffic. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays.

US 41 from Cross Street to Cochran Boulevard: Construction project: Crews improve 5.8 miles of US 41. The project includes signal upgrades at various intersections, milling and resurfacing, miscellaneous shoulder widening, bike lanes and improved pedestrian access at multiple intersections. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on US 41 during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, weather permitting. Intermittent lane closures may occur on side streets.**

- At **US 41/Parmely Street**, crews will add a new through/left-turn lane on Parmely Street to accommodate more vehicles turning left onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Parmely Street.
- At **US 41/Olean Boulevard**, crews will add a new northbound right-turn lane on Olean Boulevard to accommodate more vehicles turning right onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Olean Boulevard.
- At **US 41/Harborview Road** crews will add a new westbound through lane on Harborview Road to accommodate more vehicles heading west toward Edgewater Drive.

Motorists should be aware of heavy machinery and large trucks entering and exiting the roadway while crews install construction signage and silt fence. Please use caution and plan extra travel time while driving in this area. Project completion is expected fall 2017. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

US 41 from Enterprise Drive to Sarasota/Charlotte County Line: Construction project: Crews are working to expand US 41 to six lanes from Enterprise Drive to the Sarasota/Charlotte County line. This 3.6-mile project also includes making roadway drainage improvements, installing water and sewer lines, adding bike lanes and sidewalk and replacing signals at Enterprise Drive, Toledo Blade Boulevard and S. Cranberry/Cornelius Boulevards. Crews are installing new utilities, building new roadway and drainage. Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.

- **Collingswood Boulevard is closed on the north side and south side of US 41.**
- **Collingswood Boulevard median at US 41 is closed.**
- **Chamberlain Boulevard median at US 41 is closed.**
- **Stratford Drive is closed on the south side of US 41.**
- **Sherbourne Street is closed on the north side of US 41.**
- **Longley Drive is closed on the north and south side of US 41.**
- **The speed limit is reduced to 40 miles per hour.**

Drivers should be aware of construction vehicles and equipment entering and exiting the roadway. The contractor expects to complete work in spring 2017. The contractor is Guymann Construction Inc.

SR 776/El Jobean Road over the Myakka River: Construction project: Crews perform maintenance on the SR 776/McCall Road Bridge over the Myakka River. Marine traffic should expect construction barges and activity in the area. **Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours Monday through Friday, weather permitting.**

- **Motorists should expect shoulder closures during daytime hours and should use extreme caution as construction vehicles enter and exit the roadway.**

Boaters should use caution. Pedestrians should use **extreme** caution and stay behind the construction safety fence and out of the work zone. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Inland Construction & Equipment, Inc.

SR 776/EL Jobean Road from US 41 to Murdock Circle: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect the inside westbound lane closed from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday while crews perform landscaping in the median, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

Peachland Boulevard from Bachmann Boulevard to Atwater Street: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews install sidewalk and drainage along the north side of Peachland Boulevard. Work occurs during daytime hours. **Lane closures may occur from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.** Motorists and pedestrians should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Florida Safety Contractors, Inc.

Orlando Boulevard from Peachland Boulevard to Veterans Boulevard: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews install sidewalk and drainage along the west side of Orlando Boulevard. Work occurs during daytime hours. **Lane closures may occur from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.** Motorists and pedestrians should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Florida Safety Contractors, Inc.

COLLIER COUNTY

I-75/Alligator Alley Rest Area (mile marker 63): Construction project: Work is underway to build a new rest area and water treatment plant on the north side of the roadway. Estimated project completion is spring 2018. The design/build contractor is West Construction, Inc.

I-75 from Broward County Line (mile marker 50) to east of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101): Construction project: This safety project adds approximately 78 miles (39 miles in each direction) of guardrail along I-75/Alligator Alley. Crews will begin a moving pavement operation at CR 951 (exit #101) and work easterly to the Broward County line. Crews will then work from the Broward County line westerly to just east of CR 951. Guardrail installation will follow behind the pavement operation. Crews will work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., through the duration of the project.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures along the outside northbound lane from mile marker 77 to mile marker 89.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. The contractor is the de Moya Group, Inc. Estimated completion is summer 2017.

I-75 from the toll plaza (mile marker 100) to the Faka Union Canal (mile marker 91): Construction project: This safety project adds approximately 18 miles (9 miles in each direction) of 10-foot fencing along I-75/Alligator Alley. Crews will work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. The contractor is Gomez & Son Fence Corporation. Estimated completion is summer 2017.

US 41 from Stinkey Canal to Rose Canal: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews perform maintenance work on the bridges. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, weather permitting.** Motorists should use caution as construction vehicles enter and exit the roadway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is early 2017. The contractor is Proshot Concrete, Inc.

SR 84/Davis Boulevard from Kings Way to Santa Barbara Boulevard: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday for crews to replace power poles, weather permitting. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 84/Davis Boulevard at Radio Road: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent westbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday for crews to construct a deceleration lane, weather permitting. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 84/Davis Boulevard from Heritage Trail to Santa Barbara Boulevard: Construction project: This project includes resurfacing the roadway, adding curb and gutter, and installing light poles. Crews will also add a pedestrian crosswalk and upgrade the signal at County Barn Road. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the project.** Drivers should use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is summer 2017. The contractor is Preferred Materials, Inc.

DESOTO COUNTY

US 17 from CR 760A to Heard Street and within the City of Arcadia: Construction project: Crews are expanding US 17 to four lanes. Work is underway for two new travel lanes to the east and west of existing US 17 travel lanes includes utility activities, installation of drainage, and new roadway construction. Northbound and southbound US 17 traffic have switched to the new portion of US 17 from south of CR-760A/McCaskill Street to north of CR 760/Welles Avenue. Traffic remains on the existing lanes of US 17 north of Joshua Creek. Northbound and southbound US 17 travel lanes have shifted to the new eastern roadway from south of Fletcher Street to north of Mockingbird Street and then continues on the new roadway to north of Hibiscus Drive. In Arcadia - southbound US 17 travel lanes shifts to the east from Palmetto Street to Dr. MLK Jr. Street. SW Palm Drive is closed and the detour route is SW Hibiscus Drive to SE Hillsborough Avenue. Intermittent daytime single-lane flagging operation on MLK Jr. Street and lane closures on US 17 at signalized intersections. Motorists should continue to observe the posted speed limits. Work vehicles are entering and exiting the roadway during the week. Please use caution and plan additional travel time. Expected project completion is in the summer of 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting.

GLADES COUNTY

SR 78 from US 27 to Chobee Loop: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 78 from the Ortona Cemetery to Citrus Center Canal: Maintenance project: Crews will be performing shoulder maintenance during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 just south of the Moore Haven Bridge: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing guardrail in the median during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HARDEE COUNTY

US 17 from the Hardee/Desoto County Line to Sweetwater Road (CR 634): Construction Project: Crews are widening US 17 from two lanes to four lanes, adding a grassed median and building new two-lane bridges over Charlie Creek and Charlie Creek Overflow. The contractor will also install new roadside drainage swales and storm water ponds to manage water running off the roadway. The contractor is Watson Civil Construction. Watch for crews and equipment working close to the road. Daytime lane closures are expected for utility relocations and material deliveries. Flaggers will direct motorists through the work zone in a single lane. Please observe posted speed limits and drive with caution in the construction zone. Estimated completion is summer 2018.

SR 64 at CR 663: Construction project: Crews are constructing a new sidewalk on the northeast side of CR 663 from SR 64 to the residential complex and on the south side of SR 64 from CR 663 to the post office. The contractor is L-J Construction of Central Florida. Please use caution, crews are working near the roadway.

SR 636 at SR 64: Construction project: Crews are widening SR 636 from SR 64 to Ed Wells Road to accommodate a new left and right turn lane. The FDOT contractor will build a new section of road to realign the SR 64 connection to SR 636. Starting December 13, 2016 SR 636 will close at SR 64 just east of Ed Wells Road to allow for intersection improvements. During construction, the contractor will detour traffic 24 hours a day using SR 64 and US 17. Watch for lighted message boards and signs directing traffic around the work zone. Detour routes are in place for motorists to travel around the work zone. The contractor is Lane Construction. Expected completion is summer 2017.

HENDRY COUNTY

US 27 from Woodward Road to Air Glades Boulevard: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the outside northbound lane closed from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. while crews construct a turn lane, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 from Lewis Boulevard to CR 720: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent southbound lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, while crews repair guardrail, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 82/Immokalee Road from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line: Construction project: Crews widen SR 82 to four lanes from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line. This 1.3 mile project improves drainage to manage water running off the roadway and builds new five-foot sidewalk on the north side of the road. **Motorists should expect lane closures through the duration of the project.** Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Community Asphalt Corporation.

SR 80 from Dalton Lane to Indian Hills Drive: Maintenance permit project: Crews will be relocating utilities near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80 from Phillips Road to Huggets Road: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday, while crews pave the roadway, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80 from Double J. Acres Road to CR 78A: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. while crews construct turn lanes, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80 from the Lee County line to Cowboy Way: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be landscaping during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80 from Forrey Drive to Cowgirl Way: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be landscaping during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 29 from Case Road to Wilson Road: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday, while crews construct a turn lane, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HIGHLANDS COUNTY

US 27 from Old SR 8 to 900 feet north of Vision Street in Lake Placid: Landscaping Project: Crews are installing irrigation and landscaping. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway. Watch for lane closures and prepare to merge.

US 27 From South of Tauber Street to South Highlands Avenue: Construction Project: Crews are extending and widening the northbound right turn lane on to Highlands Avenue in front of Highlands Regional Medical Center. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

US 98 (Lorida): Maintenance contract: Crews are repairing drainage structures. No lane closers are expected, Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 at Sebring Parkway: Construction Project: Crews are extending the northbound right turn lane and bicycle keyhole. Nighttime paving may take place within the next two weeks. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

US 27 at Lake Clay Drive in Lake Placid: Permit Project: Crews are adding new access to Publix. Construction crews are extending the southbound right turn lane and extending both the northbound and southbound left turn lanes. The full median opening is being modified to a directional opening. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway. Watch for lane closures and prepare to merge.

US 27 at Alan Jay Toyota: Permit Project: Crews will be removing the old driveway. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

SR 66 at Sparta Road: FDOT maintenance crews are grading ditches. No lane closures are expected. Work will take place Monday – Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Please use caution while traveling through this area and watch for workers close to the road.

SR 17 (Lakeview Drive) between Us 27 and Kenilworth Boulevard: Construction Project: Crews are reconstructing the road and repairing damaged sidewalk. One lane has been closed on Lakeview Drive (SR 17) between US 27 and Kenilworth Boulevard to reconstruct the roadway. Traffic has been shifted to the newly paved southbound lane but will continue to flow northbound. Southbound traffic is being detoured 24 hour a day over the next few months using US 27, South Highlands Avenue and Kenilworth Boulevard. Nighttime paving may take place within the next two weeks. Motorists should use caution while traveling through this area. FDOT and the contactor will maintain access to homes and businesses during construction. Detour routes are in place for motorists to travel around the work zone. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

LEE COUNTY

US 41 from Dana Drive to Pine Drive: Maintenance project: Crews will be installing sidewalk on the west side of the roadway during daytime hours Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway

US 41 from just south of Pelican Colony Boulevard to San Carlos Boulevard: Construction project: This project installs light poles on both sides of the roadway. Work occurs during daytime and nighttime hours. Motorists should expect lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Saturday, weather permitting. Motorists and pedestrians should use caution traveling in the work zone. Estimated project completion is spring 2018. The contractor is Valiant Power South.

US 41 Caloosahatchee Bridge: Construction project: Crews perform maintenance on the US 41 bridge over the Caloosahatchee River. Marine traffic should expect construction barges and activity in the area. Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours Monday through Friday, weather permitting.

- Motorists should expect the northbound outside lane closed during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. Wednesday, December 14 to 6 a.m. Thursday, December 15, weather permitting.

Boaters should use caution. Pedestrians should use **extreme** caution and stay behind the construction safety fence and out of the work zone. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Inland Construction & Equipment, Inc.

US 41 from Cedar Creek Drive to South Bay Drive: Maintenance project: Crews will be performing shoulder maintenance and installing sod during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 41 from Sanibel Boulevard to Emerson Square Boulevard: Maintenance project: Crews will be performing shoulder maintenance and installing sod during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 884/Colonial Boulevard from SR 739/Metro Parkway to Veronica Shoemaker Boulevard: Construction project: This project builds a multi-use path and improves pedestrian access at bus stops on the north side of the roadway. Work occurs during daytime hours. Motorists should expect intermittent westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Motorists and pedestrians should follow detour signs and use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is spring of 2017. The contractor is Rogar Management & Consulting of Florida, LLC.

SR 739/Fowler Street at Thompson Street: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the southbound outside left lane closed during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. Wednesday, December 14 to 5 a.m. Thursday, December 15 while crews perform utility work, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 78/Pine Island Road/Bayshore Road from US 41 to Hart/New Post Road: Construction project: This project includes resurfacing the roadway, bike lanes and signal upgrades at various intersections. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the project. Intermittent lane closures may occur on side streets.** Drivers should use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is fall 2017. The contractor is AJAX Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 78 at Coon Road: Construction project: Crews will be replacing the signal mast arm at the southeast corner of the intersection. Motorist should expect lane closures during nighttime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 78/Pine Island Road from Santa Barbara Boulevard to Chiquita Boulevard: Maintenance project: Crews will be striping the roadway during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

State Roadways (SR 31, SR 45, SR 78, SR 80, SR 82, SR 739, SR 865 and SR 867): Maintenance contract project: Crews are sweeping curb and gutter on state roadways and bridges. Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. weather permitting. Motorists should expect slow moving traffic and possible delays.

Leeland Heights Boulevard from Georgia Road to Richmond Avenue: Construction project: This project includes sidewalk installation and drainage improvements to the north side of the roadway. Work occurs during daytime hours. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Local area residents will have access at all times. Intermittent lane closures may occur on side streets.**

- **Motorists should expect the outside westbound lane closed from Lee Boulevard to Georgia Road.**
- **Motorists should expect California Road closed on the north side of Leeland Heights Boulevard.**
- **Motorists should expect Idaho Road closed on the north side of Leeland Heights Boulevard.**

Motorists and pedestrians should follow detour signs and use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is spring of 2017. The contractor is Wright Construction Group, Inc.

Marvaez Street from Commercial Drive to Winkler Avenue: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews install sidewalk and drainage along the west side of Marvaez Street. Work occurs during daytime hours. **Motorists should expect the southbound lane closed through the duration of the project. Local area residents will have access at all times.** Motorists and pedestrians should follow detour signs and use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Owen-Ames-Kimball Company, Inc.

Midway Avenue from Canal Street to Edison Avenue: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent southbound lane closures as crews install sidewalk and drainage along the west side of Midway Avenue. Work occurs during daytime hours. **Local area residents will have access at all times.** Motorists and pedestrians should follow detour signs and use caution while driving in this area. Estimated project completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Owen-Ames-Kimball Company, Inc.

MANATEE COUNTY

Manatee County: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are trimming and pruning trees along state roadways within Manatee and Sarasota counties. Use caution and expect possible delays.

I-75 (SR 93) / University Parkway Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI)
(Sarasota/Bradenton): Construction Project:

**Detour – Westbound University Parkway and Eastbound University Parkway
CLOSED under I-75 at the I-75/University Parkway Interchange:**

Sunday, December 11 through Saturday, December 17 during nighttime hours.
Details below:

The contractor anticipates implementing a temporary detour route on University Parkway at the I-75/University Parkway interchange at night/overnight beginning Sunday, December 11 through Saturday, December 17 between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. each night while crews demolish the I-75 northbound bridge over University Parkway and begin construction of the new bridge.

Motorists traveling westbound on University Parkway (east of I-75) wishing to travel west through the interchange are directed to travel northbound on I-75, exit at westbound SR 70/Exit 217B, enter southbound I-75, and exit at University Parkway/Exit 213.

Motorists traveling northbound on I-75 wishing to travel west on University Parkway are directed to exit at westbound SR 70/Exit 217B (north of the closure), enter southbound I-75, and exit at University Parkway/Exit 213.

Motorists traveling eastbound on University Parkway (west of I-75) wishing to travel east through the interchange are directed to travel southbound on I-75, exit at Fruitville Road/Exit 210, enter northbound I-75, and exit at University Parkway/Exit 213.

Motorists traveling southbound on I-75 wishing to travel east on University Parkway are directed to exit at Fruitville Road/Exit 210 (south of the closure), enter northbound I-75, and exit at University Parkway/Exit 213.

US 41/Venice By-Pass from Gulf Coast Boulevard to Bird Bay Drive: Construction project: Crews continue installing utility and storm drain systems and constructing temporary pavement. Expect intermittent nighttime/overnight northbound and southbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. throughout the project limits while crews are working.

TRAFFIC SHIFT: Motorists on north and southbound US 41 between Venice Avenue and Bird Bay Drive should be prepared for a shift in the travel lanes. Use caution while traveling through the work zone.

Motorists should be mindful of the construction signs in place and traffic control officers and use caution while traveling through the project area. Bergeron Land Development is the contractor. Expected completion is spring 2018.

US 41 over Myakkahatchee Creek: Construction project: Crews are constructing new pedestrian overpasses over Myakkahatchee Creek; improving drainage; installing guardrail, and constructing new sidewalk. Expect daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and nighttime/overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. while crews are working. Cone & Graham, Inc. is the contractor. Expected completion is spring 2017.

US 41 from Browning Street to 11th Street: Construction project: Crews are resurfacing the roadway; installing new drainage; installing highway lighting, curb and gutter; constructing new sidewalk, and installing new signing and pavement markings. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on US 41; US 301; Fruitville Road, and Orange Avenue while crews are working. Preferred Materials, Inc. is the contractor. Expected completion is fall 2017.

US 41 between Datura Street and Hyde Park Street: Maintenance permits project: Crews are making asphalt repairs. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Wednesday, December 21. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 789 at New Pass Bridge: Construction project: Crews are updating the Bridge Tender house, electrical components, and the gates. Expect nighttime/overnight sidewalk closures from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. while crews are working. Quinn Construction is the contractor. Expected completion is spring 2017.

SR 758/Bee Ridge Road/Osprey Avenue from Siesta Drive to Dunn Drive: Construction project: The traffic currently shifts to the north from US 41/Tamiami Trail to west of Beneva Road. The south sidewalk remains closed behind the barrier wall & is part of the construction zone at this time. Pedestrians must use the north sidewalk from US 41/Tamiami Trail to Beneva Road.

Traffic then shifts to the south from Beneva Road east to McIntosh Road as crews begin storm drainage work in selected areas on the north side of the roadway. The north sidewalk is closed in this location and pedestrians will be directed to the new sidewalk on the south side of Bee Ridge Road.

Swift Road/Tuttle Avenue Traffic Shift: Crews continue major storm drainage work on the south side of the intersection of Swift Road/Tuttle Avenue and Bee Ridge Road. **Crews continue to shift traffic to the west on Swift Road/Tuttle Avenue** while they resolve a conflict in the drainage work on the east corner. Traffic is reduced to one lane each north and south as well as a left turn lane onto Bee Ridge Road. Please use extreme caution through this intersection and follow the traffic control devices that guide you through the area.

Stay alert for other intermittent lane closures during nighttime operations as well as slow moving construction vehicles throughout the project. As always, use caution while driving through the project.

Motorists should plan additional travel time as the construction operation progresses across driveways and side streets.

Side Street Advisories: Crews continue removal, repair and installation of storms drains along Bee Ridge on the south side of the road as well as water main work for the city of Sarasota which may require intermittent side street closures. Crews continue completing storm drainage operations on the south side of the roadway and may close Bell Avenue, Murdock Avenue, Midland or Whipporwill for a few days, one at a time, as they progress. Crews will close Riviera Drive on the north side of Bee Ridge to install storm drainage in that location and may close Radnor Place, Asbury or Belmont next, one at a time. Motorists should pay special attention throughout this project and follow the detour signage in place to access streets to and from Bee Ridge Road.

The project consists of significant drainage improvements, removing old asphalt and resurfacing the roadway, reconstructing sidewalk, and installing new signalization in some areas. The project also includes construction of eleven (11) pedestrian refuge islands on Bee Ridge Road between Dunn Drive and US 41. Expected completion of the \$17 million project is late summer of 2017.

SR 758 at San Remo Terrace: Maintenance permits project: Crews are relocating utilities. Expect intermittent daytime lane closures controlled by flaggers from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, December 12 through Thursday, December 22. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 72/Stickney Point Road at SR 758/Midnight Pass Road: Construction project: Crews add a pedestrian refuge island at the northeast corner of the intersection. This project also includes tightening the right turn, updating ADA accommodations and adding a four-foot shoulder along the westbound to northbound turn. Crews will work on the project during daytime and nighttime hours. Motorists should expect lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 10:30 p.m. to 7 a.m. Some sidewalk closures will be necessary. Use caution and expect possible delays. Project completion is expected early 2017. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida Inc.

SR 72 at Proctor Road: Maintenance permits project: Crews are constructing a turn lane and driveway. Expect daytime intermittent lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through early January. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 72 east of I-75 to Myakka Valley Ranches: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are cleaning the roadside ditches along this corridor. Use caution and expect possible delays.
