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DISTRICT ONE ROADWATCH REPORT #19 FOR WEEK OF MAY 8, 2016

District One is 12 counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk and Sarasota

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit www.FL511.com or dial "511" from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state.

If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

I-75 from south of Harborview Road (mile marker 167) to Sumter Boulevard (mile marker 182): Construction project: This project widens the road from four to six lanes and adds a 12-foot travel lane and 10-foot shoulder to the inside of existing northbound and southbound I-75.

- **Motorists should expect the southbound on-ramp at Harborview Road (exit #167) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Friday, May 6 and Sunday, May 8, weather permitting. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect the northbound off-ramp at Harborview Road (exit #167) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, May 9 and Tuesday, May 10, weather permitting. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect Raintree Street to be closed temporarily for the next several months at the I-75 overpass. Motorists should follow detour signs**

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2017. The contractor is Astaldi Construction Corporation.

I-75 from Lee/Charlotte County Line to North Jones Loop Road (mile marker 161):

Construction project: Crews are adding lanes, resurfacing the existing roadway, performing bridge work, making drainage improvements, and adding guardrail, signs and pavement markings from the Lee/Charlotte County line to south of Tuckers Grade (exit #158). Crews are also making drainage improvements from north of Tuckers Grade (exit #158) to south of North Jones Loop Road (exit #161). **Motorists should expect lane closures on I-75 during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.** Motorists should also use caution as construction vehicles and equipment enter and exit the roadway. PLEASE DRIVE WITH CARE. Variable message boards notify motorists of anticipated closures. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

US 41 from Cross Street to Cochran Boulevard: Construction project: Crews improve 5.8 miles of US 41. The project includes signal upgrades at various intersections, milling and resurfacing, miscellaneous shoulder widening, bike lanes and improved pedestrian access at multiple intersections.

- At **US 41/Parmely Street**, crews will add a new through/left-turn lane on Parmely Street to accommodate more vehicles turning left onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Parmely Street.
- At **US 41/Olean Boulevard**, crews will add a new northbound right-turn lane on Olean Boulevard to accommodate more vehicles turning right onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Olean Boulevard.
- At **US 41/Harborview Road** crews will add a new westbound through lane on Harborview Road to accommodate more vehicles heading west toward Edgewater Drive.

Motorists should be aware of heavy machinery and large trucks entering and exiting the roadway while crews install construction signage and silt fence. Please use caution and plan extra travel time while driving in this area. Cost of project is \$14.5 million. Project completion is expected fall 2017. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

US 41 from Enterprise Drive to Sarasota/Charlotte County Line: Construction project:

Crews are working to expand US 41 to six lanes from Enterprise Drive to the Sarasota/Charlotte County line. This 3.6-mile project also includes making roadway drainage improvements, installing water and sewer lines, adding bike lanes and sidewalk and replacing signals at Enterprise Drive, Toledo Blade Boulevard and S. Cranberry/Cornelius Boulevards. Crews are installing new utilities, building new roadway and drainage. Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound

lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.

- **Como Street is closed at US 41. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Flamingo Street will close when Como Street is open at the end of the week.**
- **Collingswood Boulevard is closed at US 41. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Northbound and southbound traffic is shifted to the inside lanes**
- **Chamberlain Boulevard at US 41 is open. The Chamberlain Boulevard median opening is closed.**
- **The speed limit is reduced to 40 miles per hour**

Drivers should be aware of construction vehicles and equipment entering and exiting the roadway. The contractor expects to complete work in spring 2017. The contractor is Guymann Construction Inc.

US 41 from Charlotte County line to Morningside Drive: Construction project: Crews will be widening northbound shoulders and resurfacing the roadway. This project also includes updating signage and pavement markings. Work occurs during daytime and nighttime hours. **Motorists should expect intermittent northbound lane closures through the duration of the project.**

- **Southbound traffic now uses the west side of the roadway at the Charlotte/Lee County line. Motorists exiting driveways and side streets in this area should use caution.**

Drivers should use caution traveling in this area. Estimated completion is spring 2016. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

US 41 over the Peace River: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside southbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday for crews to perform maintenance on the bike path and sidewalk. Drivers should use caution and expect delays as crews work in the roadway.

SR 776/Veterans Boulevard from US 41/Tamiami Trail to Murdock Circle: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect inside eastbound lane closed from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., weekdays, for crews to perform maintenance on the median. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

COLLIER COUNTY

I-75 from Broward County Line (mile marker 25) to east of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101): Construction project: This safety project adds approximately 78 miles (39 miles in each direction) of guardrail along I-75/Alligator Alley from the Broward County line to east of CR 951 in Collier County. Crews will begin a moving pavement operation at CR 951 (exit #101) and work easterly to the Broward County line. Crews will then work from the Broward County line westerly to just east of CR 951. Guardrail installation will follow behind the pavement operation. Crews will work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays, with intermittent lane closures. Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., through the duration of the project.

- **Motorists should expect the outside southbound lane closed from mile marker 50 to mile marker 53.**
- **Crews will be installing guardrail along the southbound roadway from mile marker 91 to mile marker 90.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. The contractor is the de Moya Group, Inc. Estimated completion is summer 2017.

I-75 from north of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101) to just north of Golden Gate Parkway (mile marker 105): Construction project: This project widens the road from four to six lanes and adds a 12-foot travel lane and 10-foot shoulder to the inside of existing northbound and southbound I-75.

- **Motorists should expect the northbound on-ramp at Golden Gate Parkway (exit #105) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, May 9 through Friday, May 13, weather permitting, for crews to install light poles. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect southbound traffic shifted onto the newly constructed inside lanes on Thursday, May 12 at 8 p.m., weather permitting.**

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

US 41 at Pelican Marsh Boulevard: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. for crews to make signalization improvements at the intersection. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

US 41 from Mosquito Canal to SR 29: Construction project: Crews are resurfacing US 41 from east of the Mosquito Canal to SR 29. This project also includes widening the shoulder and replacing the guardrail.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Friday for crews to stripe the roadway.**

Flaggers will be on site to maintain traffic. Drivers should expect possible delays and use caution while crews work in the roadway. Estimated completion is spring 2016. The contractor is General Asphalt Company, Inc.

US 41 from Six L's Farm Road to CR 92/San Marco Road: Construction project: Crews are constructing a multi-use path on the south side of roadway. **The speed limit will be reduced from 60 mph to 50 mph during the day.** The speed limit will remain at 45 mph during nighttime hours. Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures while crews are working. Driver should use caution traveling in the work zone. Estimated completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Community Asphalt Corporation.

SR 951/Collier Boulevard from Tower Road to Championship Drive: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the outside southbound lane closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday, for crews to install concrete poles. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

DESOTO COUNTY

US 17 from CR 760A to Heard Street and within the City of Arcadia: Construction project: Crews are expanding US 17 to four lanes. Work is underway for two new travel lanes to the east and west of existing US 17 travel lanes includes utility activities, installation of drainage, and new roadway construction. Northbound and southbound US 17 traffic have switched to the new portion of US 17 from south of CR-760A/McCaskill Street to north of CR 760/Welles Avenue. Traffic remains on the existing lanes of US 17 north of Joshua Creek. In Arcadia, there will be intermittent lane closures on US 17, SR 70 and side streets for sidewalk improvements. **NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN - Southbound US 17 travel lane is shifting to the east from Palmetto Street to Dr. MLK Jr. Street.** SW Hibiscus Dr. is closed, and the detour route is SW Palm Dr. to SE Hillsborough Ave. Motorists should continue to observe the posted speed limits. Work vehicles are entering and exiting the roadway during the week. Please use caution and plan additional travel time. Expected project completion is in the summer of 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting.

GLADES COUNTY

SR 78 from Canal Boat Ramp to Okeechobee County Line: Construction project: Crews are re-setting guardrail and paving throughout project limits. Watch for single lane closures with flaggers directing traffic. Work on this project includes resurfacing and resetting guardrail. Expected project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Lawrence-Lynch Corporation. Motorists should use caution when traveling through the work zone.

SR 78 in the City of Lakeport: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 from the Highlands County Line to the City of Palmdale: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 from SR 78/Lakeport Road to 3 miles north of the City of Palmdale: Maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Friday while crews make asphalt repairs at various locations. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

HARDEE COUNTY

US 17 from KD Revell Road to REA Road: Construction Project: Crews are constructing sidewalk on the east side of US 17. Work will take place during the day and will require minimal lane closures. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HENDRY

SR 82/Immokalee Road from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line: Construction project: Crews widen SR 82 to four lanes from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line. This 1.3 mile project improves drainage to manage water running off the roadway and builds new five-foot sidewalk on the north side of the road. **Motorists should expect lane closures through the duration of the project while crews are working and use caution traveling in the work zone.**

- **Motorists should expect traffic shifted onto the newly constructed lanes on the north side of the road.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Community Asphalt Corporation.

SR 80 at Hendry Isles Boulevard: Maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside eastbound and westbound lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Thursday, for crews to landscape. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HIGHLANDS COUNTY

US 441 from SE 126th Boulevard to Martin County line: Permit project: Crews are rebuilding an existing driveway. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

US 27 from Golfview Drive to Tubbs Road: Construction project: Watch for periodic nighttime lane closures while crews load and unload equipment and materials. The channel beneath the bridge that provides access between Lake Jackson and Little Lake Jackson will remain closed for the remainder of the project while crews dredge the channel. Expected completion is spring 2016. The contractor is Douglas Higgins, Inc.

US 27 Southbound across from Northwood Blvd: Permit project: Crews are closing the outside southbound lane during the day to construct a deceleration lane. Watch for workers close to the road and be prepared to merge.

SR 70 from CR 29 to Okeechobee County Line: Maintenance project: Crews are trimming bushes around guardrails in various locations Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

SR 17 from US 27 to South Lakeview Terrace (Sebring): Utility permit work: Crews are replacing poles and relocating utilities. Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures, use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 17 from San Remo Ave to Ponce De Leon Pkwy: Permit project: Crews are finish grading and sodding around a new driveway. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

US 27 Southbound over Josephine Cree (four miles south of SR 66): Maintenance project: Crews will be making routine repairs on the bridge deck. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures weekdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Watch for workers and be prepared to merge.

SR 70 from the Highlands county line to CR721 South: Maintenance contract: contractors will be replacing side drainpipes. We expect no lane closures and, motorists should use caution, as crews will be working near the roadway.

US 27 Southbound at Schumacher Road: Permit project: Crews are accessing a manhole in the street. Watch for workers close to the road and be prepared to merge.

SR 66 from Jess Durrance Road to Payne Road: FDOT maintenance crews are cleaning ditches. Motorists can expect lane closures Monday – Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Please use caution while traveling through this area and watch for workers close to the road.

LEE COUNTY

US 41 from Littleton Road to Stockton Street: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing sidewalk on the south side of the roadway from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

US 41 from Batista Farms Road to Elwood Road: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect outside southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, for crews to construct a deceleration lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

US 41 from Santa Elena Drive to Hickory Drive: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect outside southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, for crews to construct a deceleration lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 884/Colonial Boulevard at I-75: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and intermittent eastbound lane closures from 7 p.m. to 2 p.m. for crews to make improvements to the intersection. Work includes modifications to the westbound and southbound dual left turn lanes and I-75 entrance ramps. Crews will also make modifications to the island between the eastbound/southbound and westbound/southbound entrance ramps. The job installs new signal mast arms for westbound and southbound dual left turn lanes. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 867/McGregor Boulevard at A&W Bulb Road: Construction project: This intersection improvement project installs a new traffic signal at the intersection of SR 867/McGregor Boulevard and A&W Bulb Road. Work includes a new traffic signal, median modifications and resurfacing. The improvements also add sidewalks, signs and pavement markings.

- **Motorists should expect lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the project.**

Drivers should use caution traveling in this area. Estimated project completion is early summer 2016. The Contractor is Wright Construction Group.

SR 739/Evans Avenue at Thompson Street: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p. m. to 6 a.m. for crews to make signalization improvements at the intersection. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 82/Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard at Fowler Street: Construction project: This intersection improvement project upgrades traffic signals, sidewalks and signage and pavement markings. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., through the duration of the project. Drivers should use caution traveling in this area. Estimated project completion is early summer 2016. The Contractor is Wright Construction Group.

SR 82/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard from Evans Avenue to Ortiz Avenue: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent inside eastbound and westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday, for crews to replace mulch in the median. Drivers should expect delays and use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 78/Pine Island Road at Hibiscus Drive: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., weekdays, for crews to construct a turn lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

Santa Barbara Boulevard at SE 24th Street: Construction project: motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., weekdays, for crews to install new signing and pavement markings at the intersection. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

State Roadways (SR 31, SR 78, SR 80, and SR 82): Maintenance contract project: Crews are restriping lanes. Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. weather permitting. Motorists should expect slow moving traffic and possible delays.

OKEECHOBEE COUNTY

US 441 from SW 8th Street to SW 28th Street: Maintenance contract project: Crews are repairing storm drains. Watch for northbound and southbound lane closures and be prepared to merge.

US 441 from NE 224th St. (Orange Ave) North to the County Line: Maintenance project: Use caution and watch for workers close to the road making spot repairs to the shoulder.

US 441 from NW 11th Street to NW 16th Street: Permit project: Crews are installing underground utilities. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

SR 70 from NE 13th Avenue east to NE 34th: Avenue: Maintenance project: Crews are spraying herbicide on the sidewalks on both the north and south side of SR 70 during the day. Use caution while traveling through this area.

SR 70 from NE 31st Avenue to Berman Road: Construction project: Workers are installing drainage and grading embankment, dressing shoulders and placing sod, forming and pouring sidewalk, and building subgrade and base for the new roadway, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Sunday through Saturday, weather permitting.

- Expect lane closures on SR 70 at NE 128th Avenue/Berman Road for pipe work and paving operations.
- NE 42nd Terrace at SR 70 remains closed while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour.
- NE 46th Terrace at SR 70 is closed while crews install pipe across the roadway. Follow the posted detour.
- NE 55th Terrace is closed, while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour at NE 48th Avenue.
- NE 64th Drive is closed while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour.

During this project, crews will expand the roadway to four lanes, construct concrete bridges, improve drainage, build curb, gutter, and sidewalk, and install guardrail, permanent signs and pavement markings. Watch for crews and equipment working close to the road. Observe posted speed limits and drive with caution in the construction zone. Estimated completion is summer 2017. The contractor is Ranger Construction Industries, Inc.

SR 70 east of Okeechobee/NE 34th Avenue to Williams Road/NE 48th Avenue in Okeechobee: Maintenance permit project: Crews are relocating utilities along the south side of the road. No lane closures are scheduled, but use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

SR 70 west of US 27: Maintenance permit project: Watch for workers close to the road while they work from the shoulders cleaning ditches. Use caution driving in these areas.

County Road 68 / NW 160th Street from US 98 to US 441: Construction project: Crews are placing construction signage and installing erosion control barriers. The project consists of milling and resurfacing, constructing paved shoulders, adding guardrail and drainage improvements. Motorists should use caution and watch for workers near the road. Expected completion is early 2017. The contractor is Lawrence-Lynch Corporation.

SR 78 over Kissimmee River, 4.7 miles west of US 441: Bridge maintenance: Crews will be performing routine bridge inspection. Inspection will require intermittent lane closures during daylight hours. Flaggers will direct motorists through the work zone in a single lane. Motorists should use caution and watch for crews near the roadway

POLK COUNTY

I-4/SR 559 Interchange (Auburndale): Construction project:

DETOUR –Eastbound I-4 CLOSED at the I-4/SR 559 Interchange, Exit 44:

Thursday, May 12. Details below:

The contractor anticipates a temporary detour route at the I-4/SR 559 interchange at night/overnight Thursday, May 12 between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. while crews relocate the crane. Signs direct eastbound I-4 traffic to exit at SR 559 (Exit 44), travel across SR 559, and enter the I-4 eastbound entrance ramp. Law enforcement officers will be present directing traffic. Expect delays.

Crews are excavating existing slopes along eastbound I-4 and adjacent to SR 559, constructing the Material Stabilized Earth (MSE) wall, and driving piles for the new bridge. **Watch for trucks entering and leaving the highway.** Drive with caution and watch for traffic shifts and temporary intermittent lane closures, changes in traffic patterns, and flaggers directing traffic as needed on SR 559.

Speeding fines double when workers are present. Project improvements include constructing a new bridge on SR 559 over I-4, expanding SR 559 from two lanes to four lanes from north of CR 559A to the westbound entrance ramp to I-4, shifting the eastbound lanes of I-4 to the south, installing lighting on SR 559, resurfacing the existing roadway, and improving drainage. Expected completion is early 2017. The contractor is Cone and Graham.

US 98 at Autumnwood Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., through Friday, May 13, along the outside southbound lane while crews build a right turn lane. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 98 and Fort Fraser Trail at Banana Creek in Lakeland: Construction project: Watch for intermittent northbound lane closures on US 98 near Banana Creek from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday as crews take delivery of materials. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

The Fort Fraser Trail remains closed at the Banana Creek Bridge through fall 2016. The remainder of the trail, including the Fort Fraser Connector Trail, remains open. Work on this project includes replacing the deteriorated wooden bridge structure and pilings with a new steel reinforced concrete bridge. Brothers' Construction, Inc. is the contractor. Weather permitting; expected completion is fall 2016.

US 98 Peace River Trail in Ft. Meade: Construction project: Crews are constructing the trail and timber bridges through Ft. Meade Outdoor Recreation Area between US 98 and Mt. Pisgah Road. Project improvements include constructing a compacted coquina shell path, two pedestrian bridges, a short path leading to the river on the south end of the trail and a pull-off area at Mt. Pisgah Road. Central Concrete Products, Inc. is the contractor. Weather permitting; expected completion is summer 2016.

US 92/George Jenkins Boulevard from Churchill Avenue to Sloan Avenue in Lakeland: Construction Project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. while crews work on sidewalk and curbs throughout the project and signals at Strain Boulevard, Brunnell Parkway and Publix Gate 10.

This project includes milling and paving, repair sidewalks and ADA detectable warning surfaces on sidewalk curb ramps, replace various curb and gutter, repair drainage structures and replace guardrail at Winston Creek. The expected completion date is fall 2016. The contractor for this project is Hubbard Construction Corporation.

US 27 from Barry Road to US 192 (Davenport/Clermont): Construction Project: Watch for temporary single lane closures on northbound and southbound US 27 while crews pave US 27 at night/overnight from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m., Sunday night, May 8 through Thursday night, May 12 on northbound and southbound US 27. Crews continue remedial concrete work, work in the median, and construction of a retaining wall. **Watch for uneven pavement and traffic shifts throughout the project corridor.**

Improvements on this project include expanding US 27 and the bridge at US 192 from four lanes to six lanes, resurfacing the existing roadway, adding paved bike lanes, building curb and gutter with drainage swales, constructing sidewalk, installing new concrete pole traffic signals at the intersections of US 27/California Boulevard and US 27/Student Drive, and installing sound barrier walls. Prince is the contractor on this project. Expected project completion is summer 2016.

US 27 (South of US 17/92) Maintenance permit project: Crews will close the outside northbound lane from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Friday, May 13, through Saturday, July 16, while they build a right turn lane, gravity wall and sidewalk. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 17 from Bartow Road to Bear Creek Apartments: Construction Project: Crews are working on the signals at the intersection of Georgia Street. Watch for daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Watch for flaggers directing traffic on Georgia Street, and be prepared to merge on US 17. Paving will continue at night/overnight with lane closures in each direction, Sunday through Thursday nights. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

This project includes milling and paving, closing some unused driveways, pouring concrete bus pads, adding/repairing sidewalk, replacing traffic signal poles at Georgia Street, and upgrading equipment and adding lighted street signs at signalized

intersections, installing pedestrian crossing signals and drainage improvements. The expected completion date is fall 2016. The contractor for this project is Preferred Materials, Inc.

US 17 at the railroad crossing between Carlton Road and CR 640: Maintenance permit project: Crews are replacing power poles in the railroad right of way along the southbound lanes, Monday, May 9, through Friday, May 20. Use caution and watch for equipment entering and leaving the roadway.

US 17/92 at CR 54 (Ronald Reagan Parkway)/Kinny Harmon Road in Davenport: Maintenance permit project: Expect intermittent shoulder closures both northbound and southbound on US 17/92 and Ronald Reagan Parkway from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sunday, May 8, through Saturday, May 14, while crews complete final roadwork. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

US 17/92 at Ernie Caldwell Blvd. in Davenport: Maintenance permit project: Crews are working off the roadway this week without lane closures. This project includes adding turn lanes and shoulders on US 17/92 at the extension of Ernie Caldwell Boulevard, approximately two miles south of CR 54 (Ronald Reagan Parkway). Contractor plans no lane closures this week.

SR 563 (Harden Boulevard) at South Parkway Frontage Road: Construction Project: Crews are installing new traffic signal equipment. Work does not require lane closures this week. Project completion is spring 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries, Inc.

SR 546 from S Ingraham Avenue to North Lake Parker Avenue: Maintenance permit project: Watch for a nighttime/overnight lane closure, eastbound, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Friday, May 13 through Monday, May 23, to remove and replace a driveway entrance. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 544 (Havendale Boulevard) from Jersey Road to 21st Street NW in Winter Haven: Maintenance permit project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures through Wednesday, June 1, while City of Winter Haven crews install slip liners on the existing sanitary main. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 60 from 11th Street to Myrtle Avenue in Lake Wales: Construction project: Work does not require lane closures this week as crews complete a small amount of remaining sidewalk work. The project will improve traffic flow, and includes turn lane and/or median modifications at 11th Street, Hunt Brothers Road, Buck Moore Road, Highland Drive, and Myrtle Avenue. Expected completion is April 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries, Inc.

SR 60 from CR 630 to Osceola County line: Construction project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. with flaggers directing traffic as crews unload materials and equipment, place fill material, start driving piles and relocate utilities at Ice Cream Slough, and clearing and grubbing throughout the remainder of the project. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

Work on this project includes resurfacing the roadway, widening roadway entrances at Grape Hammock Road and River Ranch Boulevard for right turning vehicles, replacing the roadway bridge at Ice Cream Slough with a box culvert, replacing guardrail, retrofitting bridge railings, improving roadway drainage. The expected completion date is spring 2017. The contractor is Ranger Construction Industries, Inc.

SR 37 (South Florida Avenue) from Ewell Road/CR 540A to West Pipkin Road/Lake Miriam Drive in Lakeland: Maintenance contract project: Crews are repairing sidewalk along both sides of the road through the end of May. Use caution and watch for periodic lane closures for delivery of materials and workers close to the road.

SR 37 (North Church Street) at Paradise Lakes entrance in Mulberry: Maintenance contract project: Crews will close the northern entrance to Paradise Lakes, Monday, May 10 through Wednesday, May 12, to replace a drainage pipe. Motorists should use the southern entrance to access the park.

SR 17 from Mt. Lake Cut-Off Road to Egg Farm Road: Maintenance contract project: Crews will cut trees that are hanging over the roadway. Watch for flaggers directing traffic from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesday, May 10. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

SR 33 (Commonwealth Avenue) at the intersection of Deen Still Road in Polk City: SR 33 roundabout construction at Deen Still Road is now complete. Crews removed all remaining temporary traffic control devices and officially completed all work at the new roundabout on Monday, May 2, 2016.

Please keep in mind the following tips when using the new roundabout:

- Reduce your speed and be aware of any bicyclists and pedestrians as you approach.
- Look left for oncoming traffic. All traffic will be traveling counter clockwise.
- Wait for a gap in the traffic and enter. Yield to vehicles already in the roundabout; they have the right of way.
- Do not stop in the roundabout or pass other vehicles.
- Exit to your right using your turn signal, and watch for pedestrians and bicyclists.

- The red truck apron is not a driving lane. It allows the truck trailer an area to track across as the truck maneuvers through the roundabout. Drive in the lane and let the trailer track across the red concrete as needed.

Atlantic Civil Constructors Corp. completed the \$3.8 million project almost two months ahead of schedule. Work on this project included roundabout construction, new asphalt and concrete pavement, resurfacing, installing drainage structures, curb and gutters, sidewalk, gravity walls and handrails, lighting, signing, and landscaping.

SARASOTA COUNTY

Sarasota County Advance Traffic Management System (ATMS) Phase IV: Sarasota County has contracted with Traffic Control Devices, Inc. (TCD), to upgrade the traffic signal controllers and equipment for 52 intersections throughout Sarasota County, City of Sarasota and the City of North Port. The improvements will consist of installing, integrating and testing the ATMS field elements, including traffic controllers and cabinets, Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras, and fiber optic communications cable and transmission equipment along the roadways. As part of this project, 10 intersections will receive full Americans with Disability Act (ADA) upgrades to meet current standards. Construction began on March 4, 2015 and should be complete by the spring 2016. The infrastructure of this project is now complete.

I-75: From Sumter Boulevard to River Road: Construction project: This project expands I-75 to six lanes. Crews are working in the median building cable barrier, installing drainage, and placing embankment and lime rock, and installing drainage and lighting on the outside shoulders, Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., weather permitting. Pay attention to traffic signs and barricades throughout the construction project. Stay alert and use caution in the work zone. Estimated completion is fall 2016. The contractor is Prince Contracting, LLC.

I-75 (SR 93) / University Parkway Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Sarasota/Bradenton: Construction Project:
Pacing Operation/Lane Closures – Eastbound/Westbound, University Parkway Monday, May 9:

FDOT anticipates a pacing operation with lane closures on eastbound and westbound University Parkway at night/overnight on Monday, May 9, between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. Crews are closing the eastbound lanes on University while moving the crane across University Parkway to the median and closing the westbound lanes while moving the crane to the south side of University Parkway. Law enforcement will be present directing traffic, as needed.

Upcoming Detour: Anticipate a temporary detour route on University Parkway at I-75/University Parkway at night/overnight Tuesday, May 10 and Wednesday, May 11. Details below.

I-75 Southbound Off-Ramp at University Parkway CLOSED: A temporary intermittent detour route is in place at night/overnight at I-75/University Parkway Tuesday, May 10 and Wednesday, May 11 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. to install drainage pipe. Motorists traveling south on I-75 wishing to travel on University Parkway are directed to continue south and exit at Fruitville Road (Exit 210), travel east and enter I-75 northbound, and exit at University Parkway (Exit 213).

A temporary intermittent partial ramp closure is in place at night/overnight on the I-75 southbound on-ramp Sunday, May 8 through Thursday night, May 12 between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. This partial closure affects eastbound traffic only. Motorists traveling east on University Parkway are directed to continue east on University Parkway to the traffic signal and enter the I-75 southbound on-ramp to the right.

Temporary intermittent single and double lane closures are in place at night/overnight on eastbound and westbound University Parkway from Cooper Creek Blvd. to Market Street Sunday, May 8 through Thursday night, May 12 between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m., double lane closures begin at 10 p.m.

The contractor is widening the bridge at Foley Creek, installing water main and storm drain throughout the project, excavating earth material, driving pile at I-75/University Parkway, lighting and signalization, and constructing MSE walls. The contractor is working Sunday through Saturday. **Watch for trucks entering and leaving the highway. Watch for changes in the speed limit. Speeding fines double when workers are present.**

Improvements being made as part of this project consist of constructing a diverging diamond interchange, adding an auxiliary lane on northbound and southbound I-75, constructing new bridges on I-75 over University Parkway, widening of University Parkway, widening of I-75 bridges over Errie Creek and Foley Creek, realignment of on-ramps and off-ramps at I-75/University Parkway, addition of ponds, drainage improvements, new lighting and signalization, construction of a noise wall on the west side of I-75, sidewalks, bike lanes, and pedestrian walkways. Expected completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting, LLC. For additional information, please visit the project website at <http://www.swflroads.com/i75/university/>

US 41 from SR 789 to Ritz Carlton Drive and sidewalk located along the north side of SR 789 from Sunset Drive to US 41 will remain closed until construction of the development located at the corner of US 41 and SR 789 is complete. Pedestrians should follow the established detour.

US 41/Venice By-Pass from Gulf Coast Boulevard to Bird Bay Drive: Construction project: Crews continue installing utility and storm drain systems and constructing temporary pavement. Expect intermittent nighttime/overnight northbound and southbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. throughout the project limits while crews are working. **Crews will implement a nighttime single lane closure for Albee Farm Road and US 41/Venice By-Pass beginning Sunday May 8, 2016 through Friday May 13, 2016 from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. to install storm drainage in this area. Flaggers and police officers will be present to direct traffic through the area. Message boards are posted to assist travelers as well.** Motorists should be mindful of the construction signs in place and traffic control officers and use caution while traveling through the project area. Bergeron Land Development is the contractor. Expected completion is spring 2018.

SR 789 at the Coon Key Bridge/Little Ringling Bridge: Construction project: Crews are replacing portions of the westbound bridge deck. During construction, one westbound lane will remain closed while crews are working and the sidewalk closed to pedestrians and cyclists. The eastbound lanes will remain open as will the sidewalk. Manhattan Road and Bridge is the contractor. Expected completion is summer 2016.

SR 776 from Keyway Place to US 41: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are cleaning storm water pipes. Expect nighttime/overnight east and westbound lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. and daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through mid-May 2016. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 758/Bee Ridge Road/Osprey Avenue from Siesta Drive to Dunn Drive: Construction project: The traffic currently shifts to the north and low profile barrier wall and traffic control devices are installed from US 41/Tamiami Trail to east of Sawyer Road. This shift allows the contractor to close two eastbound lanes to remove the asphalt and replace storm drainage on the south side of the roadway. There are two lanes of traffic both east and west and a center turn lane in most areas. Sidewalk is closed behind the barrier wall and pedestrians can use the north sidewalk. Motorists should plan additional travel time as the construction operation progresses across driveways and side streets.

Stay alert for other intermittent lane closures and use caution while driving through the project. Plan additional travel time as the construction operation progresses across driveways and side streets.

UPCOMING DETOUR ADVISORY: Brookside Drive remains closed at Bee Ridge Road to facilitate drainage installation operations. Motorists may use Arnold Street to Briggs Avenue to and from Bee Ridge Road. Please pay special attention to directional signs in place to direct motorists through the detour areas.

The project consists of significant drainage improvements, removing old asphalt and resurfacing the roadway, reconstructing sidewalk, and installing new signalization in some areas. The project also includes construction of eleven (11) pedestrian refuge islands on Bee Ridge Road between Dunn Drive and US 41. Expected completion of the \$17 million project is summer of 2017.

SR 72 at the Stickney Point Drawbridge: Construction project: Crews are making repairs to the bridge including concrete repairs throughout the bridge, seawall repairs, Tender/Control House improvements, painting, and repairs to the mechanical and electrical components of the bridge. Motorists should use caution while driving through the work zone and plan additional travel time. Daytime single lane closures begin next week while crews paint portions of the bridge and railing. Expect single lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in either the westbound or the eastbound direction. Motorist should also expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. extended bridge openings of up to 15 minutes may occur during this time. Expected completion is spring 2016. Coastal Marine Construction, Inc. is the contractor.

SR 72 at Gateway: Construction project: Crews are installing new mast arms and signals. Expected completion is fall 2016. AJAX Paving is the contractor.
