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DISTRICT ONE ROADWATCH REPORT #21 FOR WEEK OF MAY 22, 2016

District One is 12 counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk and Sarasota

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit www.FL511.com or dial "511" from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state.

If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

I-75 from south of Harborview Road (mile marker 167) to Sumter Boulevard (mile marker 182): Construction project: This project widens the road from four to six lanes and adds a 12-foot travel lane and 10-foot shoulder to the inside of existing northbound and southbound I-75.

- **Motorists should expect the southbound on-ramp at Harborview Road (exit #167) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. Sunday, May 22 to 5 a.m. Monday, May 23, weather permitting. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect the northbound off-ramp at Harborview Road (exit #167) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. on Monday, May 23 to 5 a.m. Tuesday, May 24, weather permitting. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect Raintree Street to be closed temporarily for the next several months at the I-75 overpass. Motorists should follow detour signs**

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2017. The contractor is Astaldi Construction Corporation.

I-75 from Lee/Charlotte County Line to North Jones Loop Road (mile marker 161):

Construction project: Crews are adding lanes, resurfacing the existing roadway, performing bridge work, making drainage improvements, and adding guardrail, signs and pavement markings from the Lee/Charlotte County line to south of Tuckers Grade (exit #158). Crews are also making drainage improvements from north of Tuckers Grade (exit #158) to south of North Jones Loop Road (exit #161). **Motorists should expect lane closures on I-75 during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.** Motorists should also use caution as construction vehicles and equipment enter and exit the roadway. PLEASE DRIVE WITH CARE. Variable message boards notify motorists of anticipated closures. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

I-75 over Jones Loop Road: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. Wednesday, May 25 to 5 a.m. Thursday, May 26 for crews to perform maintenance work on the bridge, weather permitting. Flaggers will maintain both directions of traffic. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays.

US 41 from East Retta Esplanade to north of Peace River: Motorists should expect the outside northbound lane closed from 5 a.m. to 11 a.m. Saturday, May 30 for the *It's Our Turn Memorial Day Veteran's 10K and 5K*. Drivers should use caution as pedestrians and runners share the roadway.

US 41 from Cross Street to Cochran Boulevard: Construction project: Crews improve 5.8 miles of US 41. The project includes signal upgrades at various intersections, milling and resurfacing, miscellaneous shoulder widening, bike lanes and improved pedestrian access at multiple intersections. **Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the project.**

- At **US 41/Parmely Street**, crews will add a new through/left-turn lane on Parmely Street to accommodate more vehicles turning left onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Parmely Street.
- At **US 41/Olean Boulevard**, crews will add a new northbound right-turn lane on Olean Boulevard to accommodate more vehicles turning right onto US 41/Tamiami Trail from Olean Boulevard.
- At **US 41/Harborview Road** crews will add a new westbound through lane on Harborview Road to accommodate more vehicles heading west toward Edgewater Drive.

Motorists should be aware of heavy machinery and large trucks entering and exiting the roadway while crews install construction signage and silt fence. Please use caution and plan extra travel time while driving in this area. Project completion is expected fall 2017. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

US 41 from Enterprise Drive to Sarasota/Charlotte County Line: Construction project: Crews are working to expand US 41 to six lanes from Enterprise Drive to the Sarasota/Charlotte County line. This 3.6-mile project also includes making roadway drainage improvements, installing water and sewer lines, adding bike lanes and sidewalk and replacing signals at Enterprise Drive, Toledo Blade Boulevard and S. Cranberry/Cornelius Boulevards. Crews are installing new utilities, building new roadway and drainage. Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.

- **Northbound Sherbourne Street is closed at US 41.**
- **Northbound and southbound traffic is shifted to the inside lanes.**
- **Chamberlain Boulevard at US 41 is open. The Chamberlain Boulevard median opening is closed.**
- **The speed limit is reduced to 40 miles per hour.**

Drivers should be aware of construction vehicles and equipment entering and exiting the roadway. The contractor expects to complete work in spring 2017. The contractor is Guymann Construction Inc.

US 41 over the Peace River: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside southbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday for crews to perform maintenance on the bike path and sidewalk. Drivers should use caution and expect delays as crews work in the roadway.

COLLIER COUNTY

I-75 over Rock Canal: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 9 p.m. Tuesday, May 24 to 5 a.m. Wednesday, May 25 for crews to perform maintenance work on the bridge, weather permitting. Flaggers will maintain both directions of traffic. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays.

I-75 from Broward County Line (mile marker 25) to east of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101): Construction project: This safety project adds approximately 78 miles (39 miles in each direction) of guardrail along I-75/Alligator Alley from the Broward County line to east of CR 951 in Collier County. Crews will begin a moving pavement operation at CR 951 (exit #101) and work easterly to the Broward County line.

Crews will then work from the Broward County line westerly to just east of CR 951. Guardrail installation will follow behind the pavement operation. Crews will work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays, with intermittent lane closures. Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., through the duration of the project.

- **Motorists should expect the outside southbound lane closed from mile marker 50 to mile marker 52.**
- **Crews will be installing guardrail along the southbound roadway from mile marker 88 to mile marker 89.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. The contractor is the de Moya Group, Inc. Estimated completion is summer 2017.

I-75 from north of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101) to just north of Golden Gate Parkway (mile marker 105): Construction project: This project widens the road from four to six lanes and adds a 12-foot travel lane and 10-foot shoulder to the inside of existing northbound and southbound I-75.

- **Motorists should expect the northbound on-ramp at Golden Gate Parkway (exit #105) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 24 to 5 a.m. Wednesday, May 25, weather permitting, for crews to resurface the roadway. Motorists should follow detour signs.**
- **Motorists should expect the northbound on-ramp at Collier Boulevard (exit #101) closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. Wednesday, May 25 to 5 a.m. Thursday, May 26, weather permitting, for crews to resurface the roadway. Motorists should follow detour signs.**

Variable message signs are in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

US 41 at Pelican Marsh Boulevard: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. for crews to make signalization improvements at the intersection. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

US 41 from Stinkey Canal to Rose Canal: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews perform maintenance work on the bridges. Motorists should use caution as construction vehicles enter and exit the roadway. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is fall of 2016. The contractor is Proshot Concrete, Inc.

US 41 from Mosquito Canal to SR 29: Construction project: Crews are resurfacing US 41 from east of the Mosquito Canal to SR 29. This project also includes widening the shoulder and replacing the guardrail.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Friday for crews to stripe the roadway.**

Flaggers will be on site to maintain traffic. Drivers should expect possible delays and use caution while crews work in the roadway. Estimated completion is spring 2016. The contractor is General Asphalt Company, Inc.

US 41 from Six L's Farm Road to CR 92/San Marco Road: Construction project: Crews are constructing a multi-use path on the south side of roadway. **The speed limit will be reduced from 60 mph to 50 mph during the day.** The speed limit will remain at 45 mph during nighttime hours. Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures while crews are working. Driver should use caution traveling in the work zone. Estimated completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Community Asphalt Corporation.

US 41 from Red Fox Run to Old 41 Road: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the outside northbound lane closed during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday, weather permitting, for crews to widen the entrance to the Mercedes Benz dealership. Drivers should expect delays and use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 951/Collier Boulevard from Tower Road to Championship Drive: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the outside southbound lane closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday, for crews to install concrete poles. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

DESOTO COUNTY

US 17 from CR 760A to Heard Street and within the City of Arcadia: Construction project: Crews are expanding US 17 to four lanes. Work is underway for two new travel lanes to the east and west of existing US 17 travel lanes includes utility activities, installation of drainage, and new roadway construction. Northbound and southbound US 17 traffic have switched to the new portion of US 17 from south of CR-760A/McCaskill Street to north of CR 760/Welles Avenue. Traffic remains on the existing lanes of US 17 north of Joshua Creek. Nighttime single-lane flagging operation US 17 at Fletcher St. In Arcadia, there will be intermittent lane closures on US 17, SR 70 and side streets for sidewalk improvements. **NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN - Southbound US 17 travel lane shifts to the east from Palmetto Street to Dr. MLK Jr. Street.** SW Hibiscus Dr. is closed, and the detour route is SW Palm Dr. to SE Hillsborough Ave. Motorists should continue to observe the posted speed limits. Work vehicles are entering and exiting the roadway during the week. Please use caution and plan additional travel time. Expected project completion is in the summer of 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting.

GLADES COUNTY

US 27 from the Highlands County Line to the City of Palmdale: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 from SR 78/Lakeport Road to 3 miles north of the City of Palmdale: Maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Friday while crews make asphalt repairs at various locations. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 78 from Canal Boat Ramp to Okeechobee County Line: Construction project: Crews are re-setting guardrail and paving throughout project limits. Watch for single lane closures with flaggers directing traffic. Work on this project includes resurfacing and resetting guardrail. Expected project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is Lawrence-Lynch Corporation. Motorists should use caution when traveling through the work zone.

SR 78 in the City of Lakeport: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HARDEE COUNTY

SR 64 from west of CR 663 to east of CR 663: Railroad Signal Project: Crews are working on the railroad signals through mid-June 2016. No lane closures are expected. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 17 from KD Revell Road to REA Road: Construction Project: Crews are constructing sidewalk on the east side of US 17. Work will take place during the day and will require minimal lane closures. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

Hardee County Scour Countermeasure at Various Locations: Construction Project: (Bridge Repair/Rehabilitation) Crews are working underneath bridge on SR 64 installing scour countermeasures as well as working on a box culvert off of SR 35. No lane closures expected. The contractor is V & H Construction, Inc. The project is expected to be complete late spring 2016.

HENDRY

SR 82/Immokalee Road from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line: Construction project: Crews widen SR 82 to four lanes from the Lee/Hendry County line to the Hendry/Collier County line. This 1.3 mile project improves drainage to manage water running off the roadway and builds new five-foot sidewalk on the north side of the road. **Motorists should expect lane closures through the duration of the project while crews are working and use caution traveling in the work zone.**

- **Eastbound and westbound vehicles use the newly constructed lanes on the north side of the road.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is end of 2016. The contractor is Community Asphalt Corporation.

US 27 from Rocking K Farm to Stitt Ranch: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound lane closures during daytime hours Monday through Friday while crews repair guardrail. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

SR 29 from the Glades County line to the City of Felda: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

HIGHLANDS COUNTY

US 441 from SE 126th Boulevard to Martin County line: Permit project: Crews are rebuilding an existing driveway. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

US 27 from Golfview Drive to Tubbs Road: Construction project: Watch for periodic nighttime lane closures while crews load and unload equipment and materials. The channel beneath the bridge that provides access between Lake Jackson and Little Lake Jackson will remain closed for the remainder of the project while crews dredge the channel. Expected completion is spring 2016. The contractor is Douglas Higgins, Inc.

SR 70 from CR 29 to Okeechobee County Line: Maintenance project: Crews are trimming bushes around guardrails in various locations Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

SR 17 from US 27 to South Lakeview Terrace (Sebring): Utility permit work: Crews are replacing poles and relocating utilities. Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures, use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 27 Southbound over Josephine Cree (four miles south of SR 66) Maintenance project: Crews will be making routine repairs on the bridge deck. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures weekdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Watch for workers and be prepared to merge.

SR 70 from the Highlands county line to CR721 South: Maintenance contract: contractors will be replacing side drainpipes. We expect no lane closures and, motorists should use caution, as crews will be working near the roadway.

SR 66 from Jess Durrance Road to Payne Road: FDOT maintenance crews: are cleaning ditches. Motorists can expect lane closures Monday – Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Please use caution while traveling through this area and watch for workers close to the road.

US 27 Southbound W. Camphor St. – Avon Park: Permit project: Crews will be removing a driveway and repairing sidewalk and curbing. Watch for workers close to the road and be prepared to merge.

LEE COUNTY

US 41 from Littleton Road to Tamiami Village: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing sidewalk on the west side of the roadway from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

US 41 from Batista Farms Road to Elwood Road: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect outside southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, for crews to construct a deceleration lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

US 41 from Santa Elena Drive to Hickory Drive: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect outside southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, for crews to construct a deceleration lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

US 41 from Del Prado Boulevard to Business 41/Tamiami Trail: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be trimming trees on the west side of the roadway, from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

US 41 at Pondella Road: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be lining a drainage pipe on the west side of the roadway from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

SR 884/Colonial Boulevard at I-75: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and intermittent eastbound lane closures from 7 p.m. to 2 p.m. for crews to make improvements to the intersection. Work includes modifications to the westbound and southbound dual left turn lanes and I-75 entrance ramps. Crews will also make modifications to the island between the eastbound/southbound and westbound/southbound entrance ramps. The job installs new signal mast arms for westbound and southbound dual left turn lanes. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 867/McGregor Boulevard from George Town to Riviera Avenue: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be lining a drainage pipe on the west side of the roadway from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

SR 739/Evans Avenue at Thompson Street: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p. m. to 6 a.m. for crews to make signalization improvements at the intersection. Estimated project completion is summer 2016. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 82/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard from Evans Avenue to Ortiz Avenue: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent inside eastbound and westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday, for crews to replace mulch in the median. Drivers should expect delays and use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80/Palm Beach Boulevard from Veronica Shoemaker Boulevard to Terry Park Avenue: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the outside westbound lane closed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Tuesday, May 17, for crews to plant trees along the roadway. Drivers should expect delays and use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80/Palm Beach Boulevard at Tropic Avenue: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be lining a drainage pipe on the north side of the roadway from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent sidewalk closures and use caution as crews work in this area.

SR 78/Pine Island Road at Hibiscus Drive: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., weekdays, for crews to construct a turn lane. Drivers should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

MANATEE COUNTY

I-75 (SR 93) / University Parkway Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Sarasota/Bradenton: Construction Project: Temporary intermittent single and double lane closures are in place at night/overnight on southbound and northbound I-75 Sunday, May 22 through Friday night, May 27, between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Double lane closures begin at 10 p.m.

Temporary intermittent single and double lane closures are in place at night/overnight on eastbound and westbound University Parkway from Cooper Creek Blvd. to Market Street and on the I-75 southbound on-ramp Sunday, May 22 through Friday night, May 27 between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. Double lane closures begin at 10 p.m.

In observance of Memorial Day, construction activities are suspended Saturday, May 28 through Monday, May 30.

The contractor is widening the bridge at Foley Creek, installing water main and storm drain throughout the project, excavating earth material, constructing the southbound bridge at I-75/University Parkway, installing/relocating lighting and signalization, driving piles for the noise wall adjacent to southbound I-75 south of Fruitville Road, and

constructing MSE walls. The contractor is working Sunday through Saturday. **Watch for trucks entering and leaving the highway. Watch for changes in the speed limit. Speeding fines double when workers are present.**

Improvements being made as part of this project consist of constructing a diverging diamond interchange, adding an auxiliary lane on northbound and southbound I-75, constructing new bridges on I-75 over University Parkway, widening of University Parkway, widening of I-75 bridges over Errie Creek and Foley Creek, realignment of on-ramps and off-ramps at I-75/University Parkway, addition of ponds, drainage improvements, new lighting and signalization, construction of a noise wall on the west side of I-75, sidewalks, bike lanes, and pedestrian walkways. Expected completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting, LLC. For additional information, please visit the project website at <http://www.swflroads.com/i75/university/>

I-75 Bridge over CSX Railroad Crossing: Construction project: Crews are resurfacing the roadway, installing new signing, and pavement markings. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures while crews are working. AJAX Paving Industries is the contractor. Expected completion is summer 2016.

I-75 at the I-275 and Moccasin Wallow Road Interchanges: Construction project: Crews are installing new high-mast lighting. Expect possible nighttime/overnight lane closures from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Highway Safety Devices, Inc. is the contractor. Expected completion is early 2017.

Business US 41 at the Green Bridge: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are making lighting repairs. Expect intermittent nighttime/overnight lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Monday, May 23. Use caution and expect possible delays.

US 301 from Erie/Tampa Road to Ft. Hammer Road: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are cleaning storm water pipes. Expect nighttime/overnight east and westbound lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. and daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through the end of May 2016. Use caution and expect possible delays.

US 301 from CR 675 to Moccasin Wallow Road: Construction project: Crews are widening the roadway to a four-lane divided highway; constructing sidewalk; installing highway lighting; constructing medians, and improving drainage. Crews are working Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. An alternating one-lane flagging operation from north of SR 62 to south of Moccasin Wallow Rd will be in place on Monday, May 23, 2016 or Tuesday, May 24, 2016 from 6:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. depending on weather. Expect short delays during the flagging operation. Northbound and southbound traffic shifts are expected Wednesday through Friday in order to pave the mainline; both northbound and southbound lanes are expected to remain open at all times. However, flaggers will be present at CR 675, Erie Rd, SR 62 and Moccasin Wallow Rd as needed to minimize delays to side streets. Slight traffic shifts may also be in place adjacent to the work at all other times. Expected completion is fall 2016.

US 301 between 38th Avenue East and 51st Street East: Maintenance permit project: Crews are constructing north and southbound left turn lanes and constructing a new intersection at US 301 and 44th Avenue. Motorists should pay close attention to lane shifts expected to last through Friday, May 27. Use caution and expect possible delays.

US 41 from I-275 to the Hillsborough County Line and at Piney Point Road and Dock Street (Port Manatee): Construction project: Crews are reconstructing portions of the roadway with concrete; removing old asphalt and resurfacing the roadway; installing a new traffic signal at the I-275 westbound off-ramp to US 41; improving drainage; constructing sidewalks; installing guardrail, highway lighting and landscaping, and installing new signing and pavement markings. Crews are working on concrete pavement installation, friction course placement and signalization. Construction activities are going on both during the day and at night. Motorists should use caution while travelling through construction zones and be mindful that the speed limit is now 50 MPH. Expect possible nighttime/overnight lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Estimated completion is late 2016. The contractor is Pepper Contracting Services, Inc.

US 41 from 63rd Avenue West to 53rd Avenue West: Construction project: Crews are constructing sidewalk; improving drainage; installing lighting, and placing new signs and pavements markings. Expect daytime southbound outside lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. from 60th Street West to SR 70/53rd Avenue. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures within 600 feet of signalized intersections from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. while crews are working. FDOT allows daytime lane closures not within 600 feet of signalized intersections between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. while crews are working. Highway Safety Devices is the contractor. Expected completion is late spring 2016.

US 41 just south of Bayshore Gardens Parkway: Maintenance permit project: Crews are constructing a driveway. Expect nighttime/overnight southbound outside lane closures from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Wednesday, May 25 and Thursday, May 26. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 684 at the Cortez Drawbridge: Bridge maintenance project: Crews are working on the bridge. Expect nighttime/overnight east and westbound lane closures from 9 p.m. each night to 5 a.m. each morning Tuesday, May 31 through Thursday, June 2. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 70 east of Caruso Road: Maintenance permit project: Crews are constructing a new right turn-lane. Expect daytime westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. through Friday, May 27. Use caution and expect possible delays.

OKEECHOBEE COUNTY

US 441 between NW 9th Street and NW 7th Street: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect a single lane closure on northbound US 441 between NW 9th Street and 7th Street on Tuesday, May 24th from 9:00 am to approximately 3:00 pm. This lane closure is necessary for crews to repair the railroad crossing. Motorists should expect delays and use caution as crews work in the roadway.

- Expect intermittent lane closures on SR 70 at NE 128th Avenue/Berman Road to prepare for upcoming traffic shift.
- NE 42nd Terrace at SR 70 remains closed while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour.
- NE 46th Terrace at SR 70 is closed while crews install pipe across the roadway. Follow the posted detour.
- NE 55th Terrace is closed, while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour at NE 48th Avenue.
- NE 64th Drive is closed while crews build new roadway. Follow posted detour.

During this project, crews will expand the roadway to four lanes, construct concrete bridges, improve drainage, build curb, gutter, and sidewalk, and install guardrail, permanent signs and pavement markings. SR 70 east of Okeechobee/NE 34th Avenue to Williams Road/NE 48th Avenue in Okeechobee: Maintenance permit project: Crews are relocating utilities along the south side of the road. No lane closures are scheduled, but use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

SR 70 west of US 27: Maintenance permit project: Watch for workers close to the road while they work from the shoulders cleaning ditches. Use caution driving in these areas.

County Road 68 / NW 160th Street from US 98 to US 441: Construction project: Crews are placing construction signage and installing erosion control barriers. The project consists of milling and resurfacing, constructing paved shoulders, adding guardrail and drainage improvements. Motorists should use caution and watch for workers near the road. Expected completion is early 2017. The contractor is Lawrence-Lynch Corporation.

SR 78 over Kissimmee River, 4.7 miles west of US 441: Bridge maintenance: Crews will be performing routine bridge inspection. Inspection will require intermittent lane closures during daylight hours. Flaggers will direct motorists through the work zone in a single lane. Motorists should use caution and watch for crews near the roadway

POLK COUNTY

I-4/SR 559 Interchange (Auburndale): Construction project:

Detour –Eastbound I-4 CLOSED at the I-4/SR 559 Interchange, Exit 44:

Thursday, May 12. Details below:

Expect a temporary detour route at the I-4/SR 559 interchange at night/overnight Thursday, May 12 between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. while crews relocate the crane. Signs direct eastbound I-4 traffic to exit at SR 559 (Exit 44), travel across SR 559, and enter the I-4 eastbound entrance ramp. Law enforcement officers will be present directing traffic. Expect delays.

Crews are excavating existing slopes along eastbound I-4 and adjacent to SR 559, constructing the Material Stabilized Earth (MSE) wall, and driving piles for the new bridge. **Watch for trucks entering and leaving the highway.** Drive with caution and watch for traffic shifts and temporary intermittent lane closures, changes in traffic patterns, and flaggers directing traffic as needed on SR 559.

Speeding fines double when workers are present. Project improvements include constructing a new bridge on SR 559 over I-4, expanding SR 559 from two lanes to four lanes from north of CR 559A to the westbound entrance ramp to I-4, shifting the eastbound lanes of I-4 to the south, installing lighting on SR 559, resurfacing the existing

roadway, and improving drainage. Expected completion is early 2017. The contractor is Cone and Graham.

I-4 Eastbound off ramp at County Line Road (Polk County): Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures on the eastbound I-4 off ramp at County Line Road from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m., Tuesday, May 24 through Thursday, May 26, while crews make repairs to the outside right turn lane. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 98 at Autumnwood Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., through Friday, May 20, along the outside southbound lane while crews build a right turn lane. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 98 and Fort Fraser Trail at Banana Creek in Lakeland: Construction project: Watch for intermittent northbound lane closures on US 98 near Banana Creek from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday as crews take delivery of materials. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

The Fort Fraser Trail remains closed at the Banana Creek Bridge through fall 2016. US 98 Peace River Trail in Ft. Meade: Construction project: Crews are constructing the trail and timber bridges through Ft. Meade Outdoor Recreation Area between US 98 and Mt. Pisgah Road. Project improvements include constructing a compacted coquina shell path, two pedestrian bridges, a short path leading to the river on the south end of the trail and a pull-off area at Mt. Pisgah Road. Central Concrete Products, Inc. is the contractor. Weather permitting; expected completion is summer 2016.

US 92/George Jenkins Boulevard from Churchill Avenue to Sloan Avenue in Lakeland: Construction Project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. while crews work on signals at Strain Boulevard, Brunnell Parkway and Publix Gate 10.

This project includes milling and paving, repair sidewalks and add ADA detectable warning surfaces on sidewalk curb ramps, replace various curb and gutter, repair drainage structures and replace guardrail at Winston Creek. The expected completion date is fall 2016. The contractor for this project is Hubbard Construction Corporation.

US 92 east of Reynolds Road at Shalamar Creek Bridge: Maintenance permit project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures westbound from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday, May 23 through Friday May 27, while crews remove old pipe and tie-in water. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 27 from Barry Road to US 192 (Davenport/Clermont): Construction Project: Watch for temporary single lane closures on northbound and southbound US 27 while crews pave at night/overnight from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m., Sunday night, May 22 through Thursday night, May 26, pending weather. **Watch for uneven pavement and traffic shifts throughout the project corridor.** In observance of Memorial Day, construction activities are suspended Saturday, May 28 through Monday, May 30.

Improvements on this project include expanding US 27 and the bridge at US 192 from four lanes to six lanes, resurfacing the existing roadway, adding paved bike lanes, building curb and gutter with drainage swales, constructing sidewalk, installing new concrete pole traffic signals at the intersections of US 27/California Boulevard and US 27/Student Drive, and installing sound barrier walls. Prince is the contractor on this project. Expected project completion is summer 2016.

US 27 (south of US 17/92) Maintenance permit project: Crews will close the outside northbound lane from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Friday, May 13, through Saturday, July 16, while they build a right turn lane, gravity wall and sidewalk. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

US 17 from Bartow Road to Bear Creek Apartments: Construction Project: Crews are working on the signals at various intersections throughout the project. Watch for daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Watch for flaggers directing traffic on side street intersections, and be prepared to merge on US 17. Paving will continue at night/overnight with lane closures in each direction, Sunday through Thursday nights. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

This project includes milling and paving, closing some unused driveways, pouring concrete bus pads, adding/repairing sidewalk, replacing traffic signal poles at Georgia Street, and upgrading equipment and adding lighted street signs at signalized intersections, installing pedestrian crossing signals and drainage improvements. The expected completion date is fall 2016. The contractor for this project is Preferred Materials, Inc.

US 17 at the railroad crossing between Carlton Road and CR 640: Maintenance permit project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. while crews replace power poles in the railroad right of way along the southbound lanes through Friday, June 3. Use caution and watch for equipment entering and leaving the roadway.

US 17/92 at CR 54 (Ronald Reagan Parkway)/Kinny Harmon Road in Davenport: Maintenance permit project: Expect intermittent shoulder closures both northbound and southbound on US 17/92 and Ronald Reagan Parkway from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sunday, May 22, through Saturday, May 28, while crews complete final roadwork. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

US 17/92 at Ernie Caldwell Blvd. in Davenport: Maintenance permit project: Crews are working off the roadway this week without lane closures. This project includes adding turn lanes and shoulders on US 17/92 at the extension of Ernie Caldwell Boulevard, approximately two miles south of CR 54 (Ronald Reagan Parkway). Contractor plans no lane closures this week.

SR 572 (Airport Road) at Steeplechase Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures, both north and southbound, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., starting Tuesday, May 31. This project includes milling and paving, adding right and left turn lanes with bike lanes and sidewalk. Use caution and watch for equipment entering and leaving the roadway.

SR 563 (Harden Boulevard) at South Parkway Frontage Road: Construction Project: Crews are installing new traffic signal equipment. Work does not require lane closures this week. Project completion is spring 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries, Inc.

SR 549 at the intersection of South Lakes Silver Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for southbound lane closures at nighttime/overnight from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday, May 22, while crews identify underground utilities. Use caution and watch for equipment entering and leaving the roadway.

SR 546 from S Ingraham Avenue to North Lake Parker Avenue: Maintenance permit project: Watch for a nighttime/overnight lane closure, eastbound, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., Friday, May 13 through Monday, May 23, to remove and replace a driveway entrance. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 544 (Havendale Boulevard) from Jersey Road to 21st Street NW in Winter Haven: Maintenance permit project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures through Friday, June 3, while City of Winter Haven crews install slip liners on the existing sanitary main. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 539 (Kathleen Road) at 2nd Street West: Maintenance permit project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday, May 23, through Friday, May 27, while crews install aerial cable across Kathleen Road. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

SR 60 from CR 630 to Osceola County line: Construction project: Watch for intermittent daytime lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. with flaggers directing traffic as crews unload materials and drive sheet piles at Ice Cream Slough, and begin placing pipe throughout the remainder of the project. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

Work on this project includes resurfacing the roadway, widening roadway entrances at Grape Hammock Road and River Ranch Boulevard for right turning vehicles, replacing the roadway bridge at Ice Cream Slough with a box culvert, replacing guardrail, retrofitting bridge railings, improving roadway drainage. SR 37 from Palmetto Street to West Hickory Street: Pushbutton construction project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures, both northbound and southbound, from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. while crews build a new traffic separator with pedestrian walk path in the median between Palmetto Street and West Hickory Street. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

Pedestrians should follow posted detours between McDonald Street/Cresap Street and Walnut Street when crews make ADA changes in the sidewalk at the new crossing. Crews will only close the sidewalks and detour pedestrians on one side of the street at a time. Use caution and follow the posted detour. The expected completion date is summer 2016. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida Inc.

SR 37 (South Florida Avenue) from Ewell Road/CR 540A to West Pipkin Road/Lake Miriam Drive in Lakeland: Maintenance contract project: Crews are repairing sidewalk along both sides of the road through the end of May. Use caution and watch for periodic lane closures for delivery of materials and workers close to the road.

SR 37 (North Church Street) at Paradise Lakes entrance in Mulberry: Maintenance contract project: Work continues at the northern entrance to Paradise Lakes to replace a drainage pipe. Motorists should use the southern entrance to access the park when the main entrance is closed.

SR 37 at SR 674 in Ruskin: Maintenance permit project: Watch for law enforcement officers directing traffic between 7 a.m. and dusk while Mosaic crews perform a dragline crossing operation, Saturday, June 4. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

SARASOTA COUNTY

Sarasota County Advance Traffic Management System (ATMS) Phase IV: Sarasota County has contracted with Traffic Control Devices, Inc. (TCD), to upgrade the traffic signal controllers and equipment for 52 intersections throughout Sarasota County, City of Sarasota and the City of North Port. The improvements will consist of installing, integrating and testing the ATMS field elements, including traffic controllers and cabinets, Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras, and fiber optic communications cable and transmission equipment along the roadways. As part of this project, 10 intersections will receive full Americans with Disability Act (ADA) upgrades to meet current standards. Construction began on March 4, 2015 and should be complete by the spring 2016. The infrastructure of this project is now complete.

I-75: From Sumter Boulevard to River Road: Construction project: This project expands I-75 to six lanes. Crews are working in the median building cable barrier, installing drainage, and placing embankment and lime rock, and installing drainage and lighting on the outside shoulders, Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., weather permitting. Expect nighttime/overnight northbound and southbound lane closures from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday May 22 to Friday May 27, for widening and paving operations. Pay attention to traffic signs and barricades throughout the construction project. Stay alert and

use caution in the work zone. Estimated completion is fall 2016. The contractor is Prince Contracting, LLC.

I-75 (SR 93) / University Parkway Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Sarasota/Bradenton: Construction Project:

Temporary intermittent single and double lane closures are in place at night/overnight on southbound and northbound I-75 Sunday, May 22 through Friday night, May 27, between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Double lane closures begin at 10 p.m.

Temporary intermittent single and double lane closures are in place at night/overnight on eastbound and westbound University Parkway from Cooper Creek Blvd. to Market Street and on the I-75 southbound on-ramp Sunday, May 22 through Friday night, May 27 between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. Double lane closures begin at 10 p.m.

In observance of Memorial Day, construction activities are suspended Saturday, May 28 through Monday, May 30.

The contractor is widening the bridge at Foley Creek, installing water main and storm drain throughout the project, excavating earth material, constructing the southbound bridge at I-75/University Parkway, installing/relocating lighting and signalization, driving piles for the noise wall adjacent to southbound I-75 south of Fruitville Road, and constructing MSE walls. The contractor is working Sunday through Saturday. **Watch for trucks entering and leaving the highway. Watch for changes in the speed limit. Speeding fines double when workers are present.**

Improvements being made as part of this project consist of constructing a diverging diamond interchange, adding an auxiliary lane on northbound and southbound I-75, constructing new bridges on I-75 over University Parkway, widening of University Parkway, widening of I-75 bridges over Errie Creek and Foley Creek, realignment of on-ramps and off-ramps at I-75/University Parkway, addition of ponds, drainage improvements, new lighting and signalization, construction of a noise wall on the west side of I-75, sidewalks, bike lanes, and pedestrian walkways. US 41 from SR 789 to Ritz Carlton Drive and sidewalk located along the north side of SR 789 from Sunset Drive to US 41 will remain closed until construction of the development located at the corner of US 41 and SR 789 is complete. Pedestrians should follow the established detour.

US 41/Venice By-Pass from Gulf Coast Boulevard to Bird Bay Drive: Construction project: Crews continue installing utility and storm drain systems and constructing temporary pavement. Expect intermittent nighttime/overnight northbound and southbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. throughout the project limits while crews are working. Motorists should be mindful of the construction signs in place and traffic control officers

and use caution while traveling through the project area. Bergeron Land Development is the contractor. Expected completion is spring 2018.

SR 789 at the Coon Key Bridge/Little Ringling Bridge: Construction project: Crews are replacing portions of the westbound bridge deck. During construction, one westbound lane will remain closed while crews are working and the sidewalk closed to pedestrians and cyclists. The eastbound lanes will remain open as will the sidewalk. Manhattan Road and Bridge is the contractor. Expected completion is summer 2016.

SR 776 from Keyway Place to US 41: Maintenance contracts project: Crews are cleaning storm water pipes. Expect nighttime/overnight east and westbound lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. and daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through mid-June 2016. Use caution and expect possible delays.

SR 758/Bee Ridge Road/Osprey Avenue from Siesta Drive to Dunn Drive: Construction project: The traffic currently shifts to the north and low profile barrier wall and traffic control devices are installed from US 41/Tamiami Trail to east of Sawyer Road. This shift allows the contractor to close two eastbound lanes to remove the asphalt and replace storm drainage on the south side of the roadway. There are two lanes of traffic both east and west and a center turn lane in most areas. Sidewalk is closed behind the barrier wall and pedestrians can use the north sidewalk. Motorists should plan additional travel time as the construction operation progresses across driveways and side streets.

Stay alert for other intermittent lane closures and use caution while driving through the project. Plan additional travel time as the construction operation progresses across driveways and side streets.

Briggs Avenue: Motorists may use Forest Lane to Brookside Drive to and from Bee Ridge Road.

Rockefeller Avenue: Motorists may use Maiden Lane to Iola Drive to and from Bee Ridge Road.

Please pay special attention to directional signs in place to direct motorists through the all of the detour areas.

The project consists of significant drainage improvements, removing old asphalt and resurfacing the roadway, reconstructing sidewalk, and installing new signalization in some areas. The project also includes construction of eleven (11) pedestrian refuge

islands on Bee Ridge Road between Dunn Drive and US 41. Expected completion of the \$17 million project is summer of 2017.

SR 72 at the Stickney Point Drawbridge: Construction project: Crews are making repairs to the bridge including concrete repairs throughout the bridge, seawall repairs, Tender/Control House improvements, painting, and repairs to the mechanical and electrical components of the bridge. Motorists should use caution while driving through the work zone and plan additional travel time. Daytime single lane closures begin next week while crews paint portions of the bridge and railing. Expect single lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in either the westbound or the eastbound direction. Motorist should also expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. extended bridge openings of up to 15 minutes may occur during this time. Expected completion is spring 2016.
