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Lane Closures and Traffic Shift Planned for U.S. 331 South of the Clyde B. Wells Bridge

Chipley, FL – Drivers on U.S. 331, between Chat Holly Road and the south end of the Clyde B. Wells Bridge in Walton County, will encounter alternating lane closures from 7 p.m. Monday, August 3 to 6 a.m. Tuesday, August 4 to allow crews to pave and stripe the newly constructed northbound travel lanes.

Beginning the morning of Tuesday, August 4, traffic will be shifted onto the new northbound travel lanes until crews complete reconstructing the southbound lanes in spring 2016.

All planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Drivers are reminded to use extra caution and obey the posted speed limit when driving through construction work zones.

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Lane Closures Planned for U.S. 98 in Gulf Breeze

Chipley, FL – Drivers on U.S. 98 between the Pensacola Bay Bridge and the Gulf Breeze Zoo will encounter alternating lane closures from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday, August 2 through Thursday, August 6. The closures will allow crews to perform pavement repairs in the City of Gulf Breeze, place the final layer of asphalt on the roadway within the Naval Live Oaks Park area, and perform shoulder widening work.

One lane of traffic will remain open in each direction and access to private property will be maintained at all times. Planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be rescheduled in the event of inclement weather.

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Traffic Shift Planned for State Road 20 in Walton County

Chipley, FL – State Road 20 traffic, approximately one mile east of the Choctaw Beach Park and near the old Fort Rucker Recreation Area in Walton County, will be shifted to the south beginning Thursday, July 30. The traffic shift will be in place for approximately four weeks as crews make drainage improvements.

The speed limit will be reduced to 35 mph in the work zone.

All planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Drivers are reminded to use extra caution and obey the posted speed limit when driving through construction work zones.

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Traffic pattern changing for U.S. 98 at Hurlburt Field

Chipley, FL – U.S. 98 east and westbound traffic is now using the elevated travel lanes that pass above Cody Avenue/Campaigne Street and the entrance to the Hurlburt Field main gate and sound side areas. Since the traffic shift, drivers who have mistakenly exited U.S. 98 via the off-ramps have been able to rejoin the highway by continuing straight and accessing the on-ramp.

Beginning early next week, this will no longer be possible. Drivers who errantly exit U.S. 98 via the east or westbound off-ramp will be required to turn right, to either the main gate or sound side entrance, and then make a U-turn to access the U.S. 98 on-ramp.

The U.S. 98-Cody Avenue intersection remains an active construction zone. Much work continues beneath the elevated travel lanes on Cody Avenue/Campaigne Street. Drivers should be careful to obey all directional signage and the posted speed limit. In addition, be alert for construction workers, vehicles and equipment.
