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Lane Closures on Area Roads

Chipley – Drivers are reminded to practice caution while traveling in and around the work zones in Northwest Florida Dec. 11 through Saturday, Dec. 17.

Bay County:

- **23rd Street Flyover Project at State Road (S.R.) 30 (U.S. 98)** – Works continue on the permanent bridge piers and wall for the flyover. Curb and gutter work along with grading is also taking place on the south side of U.S. 98. Grading and curb and gutter construction is ongoing on the south side of U.S. 98.
- Night time lane closures are taking place on **Harrison Avenue from Airport Road to east of 19th Street** as workers install a multi-use path and sidewalk. Currently, drainage work is taking place ahead of sidewalk work. The project is anticipated to be complete winter 2017.
- A safety improvement project to install dual left turn lanes on **U.S. 98 (S.R. 30) at Richard Jackson Boulevard** is underway. Work is anticipated to be complete winter 2017.
- The new Hampton Inn on Front Beach Road will install a new crosswalk between Hill Road and Powell Adams Road. Drivers will encounter a detour Monday, Dec. 12 and Tuesday, Dec. 13. Drivers will use Hill Road, U.S. 98, and Powell Adams Road.
- Temporary lane closures will take place Saturday, Dec. 10 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. for the Panama City Beach Christmas Parade. The route is Powell Adams Road, Front Beach Road and Pier Park Drive.

Gulf County:

- **S.R. 30 (U.S. 98) from the Gulf County Canal Bridge to South of U.S. 98 realignment** – Drivers will encounter temporary lane closures as workers pave the corridor.
- Bridge inspection crews will perform a routine inspection of the **U.S. 98 Gulf County Canal Bridge**, Tuesday, Dec. 13. Drivers will encounter temporary lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Jackson County:

- **S.R. 73 from the Calhoun County line to County Road 167 (South Street)** –Paving work is taking place along the corridor. Drivers can expect lane closures to continue.
- **S.R. 77 from the Alabama State line to Graceville** – Construction is underway. Workers will resurface the roadway, add signage, and install new pavement markings. Lane closures will remain in effect.

All planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Drivers are reminded to pay attention to the reduced speed limit when
