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Escambia and Santa Rosa County Traffic Alert

Chipley, FL – Drivers will encounter traffic disruptions on the following state roads in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties as crews perform construction and maintenance activities.

- **U.S. 98 Resurfacing, Santa Rosa County** - U.S. 98 between Live Oaks Village shopping center and the Gulf Breeze Zoo in Santa Rosa County. Alternating lane closures from 9 p.m. Friday, Nov. 6 to 7 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 7 and between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 7 through Thursday, Nov. 12. Crews will be placing the final layer of asphalt on the roadway and completing work list items.
- **U.S. 98 (Garden Street) and Bruce Street Intersection, Escambia County**- Lane closure at the intersection from 8 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 8 to 2 a.m. Monday, Nov. 9 as crews perform routine maintenance work.
- **State Road (S.R.) 196 (Bayfront Parkway), S.R. 10A (Cervantes/Scenic Highway), S.R. 752 (Texar Drive), S.R. 95 (Palafox Street), U.S. 98 (Garden Street), S.R. 292 (Pace Boulevard), Escambia County** – The Pensacola Marathon will be held from 6:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. along the following state routes in Escambia County. Drivers are encouraged to seek an alternate route:
 - Bayfront Pkwy heading east from 9th Avenue to 17th Avenue.
 - Cervantes/Scenic Hwy heading East/North from 17th Avenue to Summit Boulevard.
 - Texar Drive heading West from 9th Avenue to Palafox Street.
 - Palafox Street heading south from Texar Drive to Garden Street.
 - Garden Street heading west to Pace Boulevard.
 - Pace Boulevard heading south to Barrancas Street.

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- **Interstate 10 (I-10) Six Lane, Escambia County** - I-10 between Davis Highway (Exit 13) and Scenic Highway (Exit 17) traffic in Escambia County, will encounter alternating lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. the week of Monday, November 9. The closures will allow crews to shift traffic to the outside to begin widening work in the median.
- **I-10 Six Lane, Santa Rosa County** - I-10 east and westbound between the Escambia Bay Bridge and S.R. 281 (Avalon Boulevard) in Santa Rosa County. Alternating lane closures Sunday through Thursday through the end of 2015. Lane closures will be in effect from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. as crews perform construction activities.
- **U.S. 98 (Garden Street) in Escambia County**- Lane closures will take place on Garden Street as crews clean and video sanitary sewer lines on the following:
 - **Monday, Nov. 9 from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m.**
 - Garden Street eastbound outside lane closure at Baylen Street.
 - Garden Street westbound inside lane closure at Baylen Street.
 - **Tuesday, Nov. 10 from 12 a.m. to 4 a.m.**
 - Garden Street outside lane closure at Baylen Street.
- **S.R. 87, Santa Rosa County**— The city of Milton will hold their Veterans Day parade Wednesday, Nov. 11. S.R. 87 between Raymond Hobb Street and Berryhill Street will be closed to traffic between 9:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. Drivers may seek an alternate route.
- **I-10 Escambia Bay Bridge, Escambia County**- Alternating east and westbound outside and inside lanes restrictions Tuesday, Nov. 10 through Friday, Nov. 13. Lane closures will be in effect 8 p.m. to midnight as crews repair highway lighting.
- **U.S. 98 Pensacola Bay Bridge Escambia/Santa Rosa County**- Alternating outside lanes restrictions Tuesday, Nov. 10 through Friday, Nov. 13. Lane closures will be in effect 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. as crews repair highway lighting.
- **I-110 at Fairfield Drive and Maxwell Street Exit ramps, Escambia County**. Lane shift Wednesday, Nov. 10 on the Fairfield Drive off ramp (Exit 4) and Thursday, Nov. 11 Maxwell Drive off ramp (Exit 3) as crews refurbish reflective pavement markings.
- **Nine Mile Road from west of I-10 to Heritage Oaks Drive, Escambia County** - Eastbound and westbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. beginning Thursday Nov. 12 through Sunday, Nov. 22 as crews perform paving operations.

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- **I-110 Bridge Painting** - Drivers may encounter intermittent daytime restrictions on city streets under I-110 between Maxwell and Garden Streets as crews clean the bridges. The \$2.6 million rehabilitation project is anticipated to be complete summer 2016.

Drivers are reminded to use caution, especially at night, when traveling through a work zone.

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Lane closures in Big Bend Area

Chipley, FL - The following construction activities are taking place on state roads in the Big Bend Area:

- **State Road (S.R.) 30 (U.S. 98) from west of County Road (C.R.) 384 to the Apalachicola River Bridge in Franklin County.** Crews are performing sidewalk construction and resurfacing along the corridor. Watch for alternating lane closures.
- **S.R. 12 from U.S. 90 to U.S. 27 in Gadsden County.** Drivers will encounter intermittent lane closures on S.R. 12 from Madison Street to King Street and from Duval Street to Love Street in Quincy. Crews are paving and milling and working on sidewalks, curbs and gutters along S.R. 12.
- **S.R. 30E (Cape San Blas Road).** The speed limit on S.R. 30E (Cape San Blas Road) east of the State Park entrance in Gulf County was lowered from 45 MPH to 35 MPH Wednesday, Oct. 30.
- **C.R. 12 in Liberty County** – Crews are installing nearly one-mile of sidewalk near the school to connect the high school, sports complex, public library and pre-school along Harvell Street, Myers Ann Street and Michaux Road.
- **Interstate 10 (I-10) Leon County Rest Areas.** Rest area renovations and repairs are taking place at the I-10 rest areas in Leon County at mile marker (MM) 194. The east and westbound rest areas are closed, use the Gadsden County facility located at MM 158 for eastbound travelers and MM 166 for westbound traffic and the Jefferson County facilities at MM 233 for east and westbound traffic. Construction is anticipated to be completed winter 2015.
- **I-10 Leon County.** Temporary lane closures from mile marker 193 to mile marker 194 in Leon County. Crews are performing bridge work in the area.

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- **S.R. 261 (Capital Circle) from north of Park Avenue to C.R. 151.** North bound lane closures from Eliza Road to Centerville Road, Sunday, Nov. 8 to Thursday, Nov. 12 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Crews are performing sidewalk work.

All construction activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or re-scheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to pay attention and use caution when driving through the work zone.

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Okaloosa and Walton County Traffic Alert

Chipley, FL – Drivers will encounter traffic disruptions on the following state roads in Okaloosa and Walton counties as crews perform construction activities.

- **Choctawhatchee Bay Bridge in Walton County** - U.S. 331 across the Choctawhatchee Bay Bridge (Clyde B. Wells Bridge) in Walton County. Intermittent lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday, Nov. 10 through Friday, Nov. 13 as crews place concrete for the new bridge. In addition, drivers will encounter alternating lane closures on U.S. 331, between the relief bridge and Bay Grove Road from 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 6 to 6 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 7 as crews to perform soil mixing operations.
- **State Road (S.R.) 293 over Foxhead Branch, Turkey Creek and over Rocky Creek in Okaloosa County**- Alternating lane closure from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday, Nov. 9 as crews perform routine bridge inspections. Traffic flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.
- **S.R. 123 from north of Toms Creek to north of Turkey Creek in-Okaloosa County** - Traffic will be reduced to one lane from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 12 as crews place beams for the new bridge. Traffic will only be allowed in one direction at a time. Flagmen and a pilot vehicle will be on site to safely guide motorists through the work zone.
- **Veterans Day Parade in Okaloosa County** – Lane closures will take place Wednesday, Nov. 11 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. on S.R. 393 (Page Beacon Road) for the parade. Drivers will use Page Beacon Road, Mary Esther Boulevard, Hollywood Boulevard, Anchor Street, and Hill Avenue in Mary Easter.

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All activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or re-scheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to use caution, especially at night, when traveling in a work zone and to watch for construction workers and equipment entering and exiting the roadway.

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Safety Improvement Project Begins on U.S. 29

Chipley— Construction activities will begin the week of Nov. 9, 2015 on State Road 95 (U.S. 29) in Escambia County.

This \$893,000 project consists of guardrail upgrades, sidewalk replacement, pedestrian railing, ditch pavement, and signalized pedestrian crossings along a fifteen mile stretch of U.S. 29 from north of Champion Drive to the Alabama state line.
