Night Work on State Roads in Santa Rosa County

Chipley– Drivers will encounter minor traffic disruptions on the following state roads in Santa Rosa County as crews perform striping and pavement marking operations 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday, Dec. 14 through Friday.

- U.S. 90 just east of State Road 281 (Avalon Boulevard) to S.R. 87and west end of Blackwater Bridge to the east end of Blackwater Bridge.
- S.R. 87 (Stewart Street) from U.S. 90 to north end of Clear Creek Bridge.
- S.R. 89 (By-Pass) U.S. 90 to S.R 87.
- S.R. 89 from S.R. 87 to County Road 178.

All activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or re-scheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to use caution, especially at night, when traveling in a work zone and to watch for construction workers and equipment entering and exiting the roadway.

Traffic to Shift on State Road 79 in Washington County

Chipley – State Road (S.R.) 79 traffic will be transitioned on to the newly constructed southbound roadway between Pate Pond Road and Johnson Road as crews begin construction of the new northbound roadway in Washington County Friday, Dec. 18. The traffic shift will remain in place for at least one year. Variable message boards are on site to alert motorists of the change in the traffic pattern.

This work is part of a construction project to four-lane 20 miles of S.R. 79 from Mill Branch Bridge in Washington County to south of I-10 in Holmes County. The entire project is slated for completion early 2018.

Construction activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to pay attention to the speed limit when traveling through the construction area, watch for construction equipment entering and leaving the roadway, and to use caution when driving through work zones.
