

2009 Florida Work Zone Crash Statistics


Work Zone Crash Injuries

The Florida Department of Transportation asks you to do your job when it comes to Work Zone Safety.

1. BE ALERT

Expect anything to occur when entering a work zone.

2. DON'T TAILGATE

Unexpected stops frequently occur in work zones.

3. DON'T SPEED

Note the posted speed limits in and around the work zone.

4. DON'T CHANGE LANES IN THE WORK ZONE

Any time saved just isn't worth the chance.

5. MINIMIZE DISTRACTIONS

Avoid changing radio stations and using cell phones while driving in the work zone.

6. EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

Keep an eye out for workers and their equipment.
