

Transportation Improvements – Florida at Work

SR 951 over Big Marco Pass (Judge S. S. Jolley Bridge)
Collier County



This improvement will help relieve traffic delays during peak travel times.

Project Summary

Construction crews currently are building a new two-lane bridge next to the existing Jolley Bridge that will significantly reduce congestion during busy travel times and improve emergency evacuations. Thanks to the new bridge, people will spend less time traveling to and from Marco Island during weekday commuter hours as well as during season and on weekends when visitors and locals frequent the island's restaurants and shops.

Moving smoothly from four roadway lanes into four bridge lanes over Big Marco Pass also enhances safety for everyone.

Project Update (as of 3/8/2011)

Construction of new piers and deck is ongoing. Traffic lanes are shifted to the new roadway across from the Marco Island Yacht Club entrance to allow crews to work on the west side of the bridge approach from Marco Island.
