



1. Will I have a Lab Id in MAC?

MAC will have laboratories with Lab Ids. The laboratory listing will include laboratories in the Qualified Laboratory Program and some others listed for specific sampling and testing programs, such as the Asphalt Binder Program. If you are a user in a field office, you will not need a Lab Id for access or data entry.

2. How will I gain access to my company's information if I am not assigned to a Lab Id?

MAC will not require users to be assigned to a specific Lab Id in order to access data or perform data entry functions. MAC will rely on the Company Profile concept to assign access to users.

3. How will MAC implementation impact me?

- **Asphalt Users** – The Asphalt Plant Worksheet upload will go away. MAC will house the programming currently performed by the APW.
- **Earthwork Users** – The density log book will go away. MAC will provide the ability to record all of the information in the paper copy today plus generate the plot with the sample data graphed on the plot.
- **Concrete Users** – Concrete samples in MAC will contain both the plastic properties information and the cylinders for compressive strength on the same sample.
- **Sample Data Managers** – MAC will provide companies the ability to review and revise sample data before it is submitted to the FDOT for finalization. Some companies have expressed the need to have a higher level users, like a Lab Manager or a QC Manager be able to review the sample and test data before it “becomes official” MAC will have a way to do that with the Review User role, but it will not require companies to have a separate user from the Data Entry user. If some companies want to allow all Data Entry users to also be Review Users they can or they can mix and match depending on the company's comfort level with any user.
- **Companies** – Companies will have the ability to manage their own information and user access. Companies will be able to maintain their contact information for the laboratories and production facilities and manage user roles for existing users.
