


Transportation Improvements – Florida at Work

District One ARRA Status Report – January 22, 2009

ARRA Implementation Status in FDOT District One

- One hundred and eighteen ARRA projects are being implemented in District One including seven state flexible projects, 53 local projects, 26 transportation enhancement projects and 32 transit projects.
- Over \$156 million has been obligated on 73 projects as of January 22, 2010.
- Sixty seven ARRA projects totaling \$138 million have been advertised to date.
- Sixty six ARRA projects totaling \$110 million has been awarded to date.
- Seven bridges will be repaired or replaced using ARRA funds.
- All the ARRA projects in District One are located in Economically Distressed Counties.

ARRA Project Highlights

- The State Road (S.R.) 739 from U.S. 41 to Six Mile Cypress Parkway project in Lee County will provide a new alignment of S.R. 739. This new connection will relieve traffic congestion on U.S. 41, which runs parallel to it.
- The S.R. 951 project will consist of the construction of a new two-lane bridge parallel to an existing two-lane structure accessing Marco Island in Collier County.
- The U.S. 301 project will consist of the reconstruction of four existing lanes and will add two additional lanes from Myrtle Street to Desoto Road in Sarasota County.
- The Manatee County Advanced Traffic Management System project is the second phase of software and system improvements already underway in Manatee County.
