

## WHY IT'S IMPORTANT



### Pavement Condition



State Highway System pavement is in excellent condition, with more than 92 percent currently meeting FDOT standards.

Percent Pavement on the State Highway System Meeting Department Standards




### Bridge Condition



Almost 95% of all FDOT maintained bridges meet standards (bridges not showing evidence of structural deterioration and not weight restricted).

Percent Bridges on the State Highway System Meeting Department Standards




### Roadway Maintenance

### Transit State of Good Repair



Florida transit agencies have kept vehicle breakdowns to around one per 4,000 revenue miles—fewer breakdowns means better transit performance.
