- 1.) I know we've used the electronic transverse screed control for the last 13 to 15 years with success. Most machines being used currently by our contractors have that option, so when we do away with this requirement it looks like we're stepping backwards. I know we typically use the electronic screed control in tangent sections and then override in special areas and at superelevation areas, I'm concerned if we do away with this requirement and if the paving machine operator is less than stellar the final product could suffer for this change.
- 2.) The steel wheel roller requirement of an 8 ton minimum looks appropriate, I can't imagine any of our contractors using a 5 ton roller. Even our Maintenance rollers are larger.
