Chapter 2012-196, Laws of Florida (formerly House Bill 959) was approved by the Governor on May 1, 2012 amending Section 287.135 of the Florida Statutes prohibiting state agencies and local governmental entities from contracting for goods and services of \$1 million or more with a company that has business operations in Cuba or Syria. A requirement of this statute is any contract for goods or services of \$1 million or more entered into or renewed on or after July 1, 2012 must contain a contract provision that allows for termination of the contract if the company is found to have business operations in Cuba or Syria. This Special Provision satisfies this requirement. A usage note of All Jobs is used because the contract amount will not be known when the specifications package is prepared so the specification language addresses the \$1 million threshold instead of the usage note. Certification requirements will be handled by the Contracts Office as part of the bid documents.
