SUBJECT: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION CHANGE FOR RECLAIMED CONCRETE AGGREGATE - Use on Projects with Federal Aid

The current restriction of the use of Reclaimed Concrete Aggregate (RCA) on projects with Federal Aid is hereby removed, with the following conditions:

- RCA base shall not be used in interstate roadway pavements.
- FDOT will continue monitoring the long term performance of RCA base pavements. If FDOT finds any premature failure or pavement performance concerns, the usage of RCA in Federal-aid projects will be reevaluated.
- Until/unless the Department can furnish adequate data to support an increase, the Structural Layer Coefficient of 0.15 for RCA base material must be used.
- For existing Federal-aid projects, cost saving analysis must be included in the approval process for switching to RCA base.

This memorandum serves as a blanket approval to process this change if requested by a contractor and should be attached to the Work Order or Supplemental Agreement.
