

Changes coming to Oversize/Overweight Road Use Permits

- ► FDOT will increase the limits for self-issued permits to 16' wide, 18' high, 150' long and 200,000 pounds* on September 1, 2016.
- ► FDOT will permanently disable the Manual Routing feature in the Permitting Application System on November 1, 2016. This means that applicants will only be able to use the GIS Routing option in PAS. This also means that applicants must be diligent in reviewing the route created in detail prior to accepting the route in PAS.
- ▶ Trip Permits are the only permit type which can be self-issued.

* Permits for self-propelled vehicles will be issued up to 140,000 pounds.

▶ One trip traveling from one starting point to one destination

BLANKET PERMITS

▶ Multiple trips to multiple destinations

FAQ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I receive my permits digitally?

Yes and no. Trip Permits may be digital and presented digitally if the trip permit is readily available and legible. Blanket Permits may not be electronic. They must be original.

Does the configuration on the application have to match the actual permitted vehicle?

Yes. The vehicle type and load must match.

Are permits vehicle-specific?

Yes and no. Trip Permits are specific and must match the identification indicated on the application. These are issued for one trip traveling from one starting point to one destination. Blanket Permits are not identified to a specific load or vehicle, but must be used in the indicated configuration, and may be used for multiple trips and destinations.

May I multi-load for weight or dimension?

No, unless:

- ► There are no more than two attachments, which must be a normal part of the equipment,
- ► There are two over-length items with a gross weight that does not exceed 100,000 pounds, or
- If operation is under a Divisible Load Permit.

What is a Divisible Load Permit?

On the permit application, there is a divisible load check box where a request can be made for a Divisible Load Permit. This permit allows for configurations other than tire-sized vehicles (single unit dump trucks, single unit waste trucks, etc.) to transport divisible loads with a gross weight of 10% more than the weight formula allows. This permit is restricted to roads off the interstate highway system.

What is Night Time Travel Request?

When applying for a permit, the configuration and dimension will determine when the hours of travel will be allowed. The Night Time Travel Request is for a deviation from the permitted hours and must be accompanied by a letter of essentiality.
