One Stop Permitting By: District Utility Staff

NEW One Stop Permitting (OSP) E-Permitting for Utility Permits: The OSP database is used by the Utility Agency Owners (UAOs) and our Maintenance office.

In a continuing effort to improve customer service and streamline the permitting process, we are pleased to introduce the One Stop Permitting System (OSP). The new E-Permitting will allow utility owners to apply for and obtain utility permits on-line without leaving the office. This system is available 24 hours a day - 7 days a week. The site allows internal and external (consultant & utility companies with an existing ISA account) access to log in and submit permit applications and pertinent documents on-line.

*(It is not mandatory that the UAOs utilize this system; however any paper documents submitted will be put into the OSP system by an operations center personnel).

The website was launched in 2014 to review utility permits electronically. This program proves useful as it eliminates paper, allows for permit applications and associated documents to be uploaded in the system. It also allows project managers the capability to review documents and submit comments, tracks the status of an application and can be used as a reference tool. This process is to make the FDOT project manager(s) aware of any anticipatory changes and/or conflicts within the project limits. The electronic system will make accessing and coordinating review of permits much easier and faster.

The database is user friendly and easy; it makes the review process more timely and efficient; as ALL utility permit application(s) identified within an area of the five year work program must be submitted to the District Utility office for review. The District Utility office will assign the permit to the appropriate project manager while reviewing the package for compliance with the Utility Accommodation Manual. Project Managers has the capability to add other reviewer(s).

Why use E-Permitting? Using OSP E-Permitting is designed to shorten the delivery of permit applications and track their status. It will speed up production, save time and money, and increase permit efficiency by eliminating mailing or hand-delivery of printed documents to and from the FDOT District, Maintenance, County and Utility Agencies Offices.
