Federal Guidelines for Plain Language

What is “Plain Language” – Seven musts:

1. Instead of using “shall”, use:

- “must” for an obligation,
- “must not” for a prohibition,
- “may” for a discretionary action, and
- “should” for a recommendation.



Federal Guidelines for Plain Language

What is “Plain Language” – Seven musts:

2. **Active Voice**
3. **Present Tense**
4. **Avoid Commas**
5. **Short sentences**
6. **Omit unnecessary words**
7. **Place “only” or “always” next to word modified**

Old: Throughout this design process, quality control will be exercised by those responsible for the engineering design and plans preparation activities by having a plan-do-check routine for each and every significant task or operation.

New: Exercise quality control throughout the design process by conducting a plan-do-check routine for each significant task.

- PPM in progress
- PD&E Manual next release will be complete
- Drainage Manual not started
- Pavement Design Manual complete
- Florida Greenbook has not adopted PL
